
Pastor's Corner

Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord

Today the church comes to the close of the Christmas season. It's always a little sad for me to take down the Christmas decorations, to pack away the ornaments on the tree, the cookies are eaten, the lights stored away, the wrapping and boxes recycled...it seems a little dull to return our surroundings to ordinary time. Yet, today's feast invites us to ponder a little longer upon the mystery of who Jesus is and what the great gift of his birth means for all who believe.

The readings and reflections surrounding Christmas Day focus on a variety of messengers who announced the savior's birth. The angels announced the birth to the shepherd, the star in the sky announced the birth to the magi and they in turn announced the birth of the messiah to anyone who would listen. Today, we fast forward through the silent years of Jesus' life to reflect upon the baptism of the Lord. We hear straight from the mouth of God the Truth that Jesus is the beloved Son of God! With these words the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus and we are given a clear revelation of the gift of the Holy Trinity, the communion of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The words spoken by God the Father, "*This is my beloved Son; with whom I am well pleased,*" are also the words that we are privileged to hear at the time of our baptism when we became children of God. Ask yourself: Can you see yourself as a beloved son of God? Can you see yourself as a beloved daughter of God? This truth may cause us to blush with shame a bit because we know our shortcoming and failings. And yet, our failings do not destroy the original dignity we are given in baptism as a son or daughter of God.

Fr. Henri Nouwen once noted, "The voice from heaven saying 'You are my beloved, with you I am well pleased' is what God says to each human being. We have an identity and a birthright given to us by the One who created and loves us." This blessing and essential birthright is hard to hear above all the other voices of our lives, the voices that shout, "*you are no good, you are worthless, you are ugly, nobody cares about you.*" All of these words are lies. Our identity is found in Christ as children of God. Through the gift of baptism we are given the gift of new life, a life that is rooted in God's covenant of love; a life that is eternal.

So often the biggest problems that we have in life are because we do not claim or accept who we are as children of God. We live in the shadows of doubt trying to fill the hole in the soul with stuff or with behavior or other people's opinions that we think will give meaning to our life.

Finding and claiming our identity as sons and daughters of God in the waters of baptism enables us to cut thorough all the confusing and competing voices that come at us in life. This awareness of the life we share in Christ touches every aspect of our life. To live my baptism is to live in the awareness of being a child of God. To live my baptism is to live the call to holiness. To live my baptism is to put into practice the relationship of love that is found in the communion of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This year the only New Year's resolution that we need to make is to embrace this truth: "I am a child of God."
