Call to Action for Life and Religious Liberty

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati will participate in Project Life and Liberty Postcard Campaign, February 9/10. A postcard strip with three postcards and a Response Card will be made available to all parishioners to send to your U.S. Representative and to your state's two U.S. Senators. The Response Card asks for a person's name, e-mail address, state and diocese, and is to be returned to the National Committee for a Human Life Amendment. Please watch for details concerning this project.

The wording of the postcard: "The new Congress should come together to respect life and religious freedom. Please support and strengthen laws that (1) prevent federal funding and promotion of abortion, and (2) protect rights of conscience in health care. Government must not force Americans to violate their religious and moral beliefs or respect for life when they provide health care or sponsor or purchase health coverage. As your constituent, I would appreciate a written response telling me how you will vote on these matters."

Pastor's Corner

Our readings today invite us to reflect upon the importance of the *word*. The prophet Ezra reads from the scroll and interprets it's meaning, offering a word of hope. Jesus is given the scroll of the prophet Isaiah and reads to the people saying "today this word is fulfilled in your hearing." The church teaches that sacred scripture is the living Word of God. It is not merely words on a page, but scripture is alive in us through the power of the Holy Spirit.

One of the challenges of our contemporary society is the reality that we are bombarded with so many words. Technology makes it possible to share the word in ways our ancestors never dreamed. And yet, can we say that our ability to communicate is any deeper or richer? In some ways words have lost the power of their meaning. For example, through the use of Facebook someone may say they have 1,897 friends. In reality, many of these people are more strangers than friends. In this setting the word friend loses the depth of its meaning and value.

On the other hand, St. Paul uses words to describe a deeper meaning. Several times in his writings Paul draws upon the word *body* to help us enter more deeply into the mystery of the Body of Christ. Paul doesn't want people acting like part of the Body of Christ. He makes the strong statement: "You are the body of Christ." The physical presence of God once walked the earth. But, Jesus' physical presence was a one-time occurrence and will not be repeated in the same way. What we experience today is the sacramental presence of Christ, a presence that will continue until the end of time. Through the sacramental presence of Christ we become the Body of Christ. When we eat His Body and drink His Blood we are being transformed into the Body of Christ. We are to be the feet of Christ walking into the rooms of the sick and lonely. We are to be the hands of Christ lifting up the weak and helpless. We are to be the ears of Christ listening to the troubled and the lost. We are to be the mouth of Christ speaking the Gospel message to others. We are to be the eyes of Christ looking at others with love.

Just as the body has many members so too the Body of Christ has many members. Each of us brings a unique and valuable gift to the whole. We are interdependent. Without our involvement in the life of the church the Body of Christ suffers. This week, reflect upon how you can bring glad tidings to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives, give sight to the blind and allow the oppressed to go free. The mission and ministry of Jesus must continue through each of us doing our part to make the Body of Christ strong and vibrant today.

Charitable Gift Opportunity

Normally, a distribution from your Individual Retirement Arrangement (IRA) is taxed as ordinary income. However, recently enacted "fiscal cliff" tax legislation extends the opportunity throughout 2013 for individuals 70 ½ or older to make a direct distribution from an IRA to a qualified charity, such as our parish, the Catholic Ministries Appeal, or another ministry of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The new law also provides that you may consider such distributions made in January 2013 as made in 2012. In addition, the new law provides a special election available to individuals who took a distribution from their IRA after November 30, 2012 and before January 1, 2013, and who make a gift to a qualified charity before February 1, 2013, to treat the gift as an IRA charitable transfer even though the distribution is not directly from the IRA to the charity. Lenten Fitness Opportunity

When was the last time you took a nice walk, or spent time exercising?

We already know that both activities are good for health in body and mind-but what about the spirit?

Regular walkers frequently comment on the spiritual benefits of the exercise-whether from the time spent in nature or just time alone in conversation with God.

The Region 7 Health Ministry is inviting you to take a bit of time to experience a "walk in the spirit" by following the travels of St. Paul to Corinth as noted in the books of Corinthians. What this would entail is two things; participate in some form of exercise on a routine basis-walking, biking, treadmill, workouts in a gym; then submit the exercise and length of time (or miles) at church every week and we will calculate the miles. The Region 7 Health

Ministry will be using the church bulletins to distribute selected readings from Corinthians to focus on while you are exercising. This Lenten exercise is a way to participate in a different way, in

addition to other Lenten sacrifices, and do something good for your physical and spiritual health. During the walks (or exercise), participants are encouraged to pray for others in the world: from our own parishes, our neighborhoods, and our nation, as St. Paul would have done. The program will begin the weekend of February 9/10 and end on Pentecost May 18/19. The miles from the three Region 7 churches will be calculated together and published as collective miles in the bulletins. A labeled box will be in the back of church with paper and pencils to collect your exercise times.
