



Pastor's Corner

Lost, puzzled, angry, bereaved...these words could easily have been the emotions expressed by the disciples on their way to Emmaus. These words could easily describe the emotions of the family members from Malaysia Flight 370 or the sunken Korean ferry or the people digging out from this week's tornadoes. With eyes cast to the ground we try to make sense of a broken heart.

In his book, "With Burning Hearts," author Henri Nouwen sees a spiritual progression that takes place in the Emmaus story from Luke's gospel. The first step is "presence." When you walk looking at the ground the world is small and limited. Then someone comes along and invites you to look up and look around; to see with new eyes. The weight of the problem seems to melt away and we know that we are not alone. Jesus, the stranger, is present to us at times we least expect.

Then Nouwen identifies the next step of "invitation" within the Emmaus story. The disciples extended an invitation for Jesus to stay with them. As they talked to Jesus the world wasn't as dark and something stirred in their heart. Having accepted the invitation of the disciples Jesus shares "communion" with them, the third step, as the guest becomes the host. Jesus gives himself to us as food for the journey.

The Emmaus story does not end with communion. Rather, the end of the story is "mission" and the Communion we share is food for building a Eucharistic life. Jesus is counting on us to continue His mission, to reflect the unity that is found in Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Some time ago the parishioners of the three Region 7 parishes were invited to fill out a strategic planning survey to help provide a snapshot of the most important areas of interest to be found in our pastoral region and to discover ways for us to build unity within our pastoral region. The following summary of survey responses are offered for your reflection.

- *What are the most important things that you would like the parish to provide for you and your family?* 1) To grow in your personal faith, 2) Convenient Mass times, 3) Engaging worship experiences.
- The top four programs that parishioners have attended are: 1) Lenten Series, 2) Novena services, 3) Bible Study, 4) Parish Missions.
- The three most popular community-building opportunities parishioners would like to see are: 1) Social activities for adults, 2) Fun events that connect different life groups, 3) Social activities for families.
- The top three means of receiving parish communications are: 1) US Postal Service, 2) Parish Bulletin, 3) Email.
- The most frequent reason parishioners do not attend more faith formation opportunities is a lack of time.

I am grateful to everyone who offered their input for the survey. The information has been helpful to the Region 7 Planning Committee as they continue to meet and discuss opportunities for further collaboration between our three parishes. In this month of May we pray through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary that our pastoral region may reflect the committed love of Jesus and Mary. (*continued on back*)
