St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Galatians, *"I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me."* (2:20)

Pastor's Corner

A message from Fr. Ken:

Some of our parishioners have asked a few questions about the cane and limp that has accompanied me during liturgies these past two months. I must have been quite gimpy on one weekend because one parishioner offered me the use of their wheelchair. So far I'm able to manage with the cane but am not able to stand for long periods of time. Yes, I do have an arthritic hip that has worn the bones quite thin. Orthopedic doctors have examined the hip and have advised me to get a hip replacement because of the bone damage.

My surgery is scheduled for June 20th and after a couple of days in a local hospital, I'll be transported to our St. Charles Precious Blood nursing center in Carthagena, Ohio. In that facility I'll do rehabilitation as I get acquainted with the new prosthesis and also take therapy to strengthen the muscles in the hip and leg area. The rehab could last 8 to 10 weeks at which time I will return to the parishes to resume ministry in the Downtown Dayton Pastoral Region.

I do ask you to remember me in prayer during this time of surgery, healing, and therapy. Know that I will also continue to ask our loving God to keep you healthy as you work and care for your families and the Church.

The following poem entitled "Count" may offer some inspiration as we daily count God's blessings.

*Count your blessings instead of your crosses;
Count your gains instead of your losses.
Count your joys instead of your woes;
Count your friends instead of your foes.
Count your smiles instead of your tears;
Count your courage instead of your fears.
Count your full years instead of your lean;
Count your kind deeds instead of your mean.
Count your health instead of your wealth;
Count on God instead of yourself.*
