Pastor's Corner

A Note from Fr. Angelo...

From Monday, July 8th through Sunday, July 21st I will be participating in the 2013 General Assembly of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in Rome, Italy. Every six years delegates from Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and North America gather to elect our new leadership team made up of a Moderator General and four Council Members. This spring I was elected to serve as one of four delegates from the Cincinnati Province.

During these meetings we will also set a vision for the new leadership team to implement over the next six years. In the year 2015 the Missionaries of the Precious Blood will celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of our congregation by St. Gaspar del Bufalo. The General Assembly will offer us an opportunity to finalize the plans for our bicentennial celebration. Please keep our General Assembly 2013 in your prayers.

During the month of July I will share some reflections on three of the major symbols associated with the spirituality of the Precious Blood, namely covenant, cross and cup/chalice. Various aspects of these reflections will be drawn from the writings of Fr. Robert Schreiter, a member of our congregation who has worked extensively in developing a lived spirituality of the Precious Blood.

Within scripture the image of Blood has the ability to hold together within itself the meanings of both life and death. In the Book of Leviticus we read that "the life of a living body is in its blood." This is why blood was used as a means of communication between God and God's people.

Blood of the Covenant

The chosen people of God marked their lives and their history by a succession of covenants. It was through a covenant that God called Abraham and Sarah out of Ur. It was through a covenant that a diverse group of slaves became God's chosen people through their journey in the desert. Covenants express what it meant to be in relation with God and with other people. These relationships are to be characterized by loving-kindness, fidelity, and justice. Within our lives we see that covenants remind us of the relationships that hold us together as persons; within families, in society and in our relationship with God.

In scripture we see that these covenants were sealed with blood. The life-force which makes existence even possible is in the blood, for both humans and animals. And life is not something we own or possess; it is, rather, a gift which we have received and for which we are called to be good stewards. In the sealing of covenants blood became the means of communication between the unequal worlds of heaven and earth, between God and humanity.

Fr. Schreiter identifies three aspects of covenant that are helpful to our reflection. 1) The image of Covenant speaks to us of how God touches the world. With a covenant the people of God are given new identities. 2) Covenants speak about our belonging to God. With God we see that all things are possible. 3) Covenants always carry with them a vision for the future. Covenants do not simply define the past, but also tell us that we have a future full of hope because God is always faithful to His word.

EdChoice Scholarships Pay Tuition

If your child attended a Dayton Public Elementary School last year or is registered to begin kindergarten at a Dayton Public Elementary School in August, you still have time to apply for an EdChoice scholarship! The State of Ohio awards EdChoice scholarships to parents of students enrolled in public schools on academic watch or in academic emergency, which is the case in all but four Dayton Public Elementary Schools. EdChoice scholarships make it possible for parents to choose a private school for their child, at no or little cost to the parents. If you have a student entering kindergarten through eighth grade in the 2013-2014 school year and that child was enrolled in a Dayton Public School or is registered for kindergarten at a Dayton Public School, contact the Catholic school in your zip code to learn how your child can attend a Catholic school and have the tuition paid in full. Applications must be completed by July 31st.
