

Pastor's Corner

In the Gospel from Mark this week, Jesus says, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while". Jesus and his Apostles were seeking a place of peace. They had just returned from an exhausting missionary journey, now they were tired. They needed to "recharge their batteries" before they could continue their work. The same is true for us in our daily life. We need those special places where we can find rest, peace and new energy. Our Mass, prayers,



and spiritual readings are the first places we go to get recharged.

I have also found in watching and communicating with people there are many other places that help us find peace, rest, and reflection. These places become a source for spiritual energy and renewal. One such place is a garden. Yes, gardens can be physically draining, and very challenging, especially this summer because of the lack of rain. But the planning and planting, the weeding and watering, the hoeing and harvesting, provide many moments of reflection on nature, life, creation, family, and our own purpose for being. For some reason the flower garden or the vegetable garden just seems to open our minds and hearts to some of the more meaningful realities of life. It's no wonder that Jesus so often used stories about plants, grain, soil, and harvests when he was teaching about the Kingdom of God. So where is your deserted place where you can rest and find peace in this busy world? It's most important for us to find one. Our spiritual life, our being another Christ in this world can get tiring; we need to recharge our spiritual batteries. Just as Jesus invited his disciples to "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while", let's make sure we also take time for ourselves.

The following gardening poem has some spiritual energy for us.

Garden Spirituality:

- 1. Plant three rows of peas: peace of mind, peace of heart, peace of soul.
- Plant four rows of squash: squash gossip, squash indifference, squash grumbling, squash selfishness.
- 3. Plant four rows of lettuce: lettuce be faithful, lettuce be kind, lettuce be patient, lettuce love one another.
- 4. Plant three rows of turnips: turn-up for meetings, turn-up for service, turn-up to help one another.
- 5. Finally our garden must have thyme: time for prayer, time for family, and time for friends.

What a beautiful garden!
