Pastor's Corner

Imagine that you are Solomon and God says to you “Ask me for anything you want and I will give it to you.” What would you ask for? Initially, we might be tempted to ask for personal wealth, fame, a life free of illness or maybe a long life. Solomon’s response pleased God as he asked for an understanding heart to judge God’s people and to distinguish right from wrong. In the bible, the heart is seen as the core of what it means to be human. A hardened heart is closed to God and a heart of flesh is open to God. Solomon’s request revealed an open heart which showed his concern for God’s people and not just for himself.

God to take control of our lives we have accepted the path to peace even in the midst of the cross.

It is important to remember that the choice for that treasure is made now and not sometime down the road. In the parables of the buried treasure and the pearl of great price we see that something must be given up in order to gain the treasure. Once we have seen and experienced the treasure we realize that the earthly treasures we possess pale in the face of the heavenly treasure. Ultimately, the final action of the parable shows that a commitment must be made to make the treasure your own. In the spiritual sense it is a call to put aside our old self so that we can discover who we truly are as children of God.

This awareness impels us to share this great treasure with others. We bring from God’s storehouse both the old and the new which reminds us that there is an element of mystery to life and we pray for the wisdom to see as God sees as we navigate the ups and downs of life, living in the world but not of the world. May our prayer be like Solomon’s “Lord, give to your servants an understanding heart; one that can distinguish right from wrong; a heart that recognizes You as my true and lasting treasure.”

God blessed Solomon with the gift of wisdom, that gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to see as God sees. All too often in life we see things as we want them to be, so often filtered through our broken, sinful nature. In an address on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit earlier this year, Pope Francis noted that wisdom is not simply the fruit of knowledge and experience. He said, “If we listen to God He teaches us this path of wisdom, He gifts us with wisdom which is seeing with God’s eyes, listening with God’s ears, loving with God’s heart and judging things with God’s judgment.”

When we live life rooted in the gift of wisdom we have identified the greatest treasure we could hope to receive in life. This awareness enables us to see that the gift of the Kingdom of Heaven/the Kingdom of God is all around us. To recognize the Kingdom of God is in our midst is to recognize that God is the source of our life and that we allow God to rule the course of our life. When we allow
