Pastor's Corner

Looking at the world today, we can say we are powerless in the face of such challenging issues that stand before us and yet, the readings from 1 Kings and Mark's Gospel we heard this weekend reminds us that when we give what little we have, it can make a difference. God will increase our offering. Maybe not in the timeframe we expect or as a result of our actions, but in God's time and in God's way.

We live in uncertain times and there is a tendency to pull back, to be more concerned about "me" and "mine." The widows in today's readings offer us another perspective. They teach us the importance of trust and faith in God. They are examples of the great commandment of love we heard about last week, to love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength and to love your neighbor as yourself.

Today's gospel reading comes just before the Last Supper meal that Jesus is to share with his disciples. Jesus takes note of the widow because of all the religious figures and leaders he has met in the Temple, she is the one with whom he could identify. Like the widow woman, Jesus will soon be asked to give his whole livelihood, a total offering of his life upon the cross. In sacrificial giving, we are reminded that all life is a gift from God and all life is offered back to God in loving service.



I am challenged by the generosity of these widows. How would I act if I were down to my last few pennies? I might be more like the child holding a crumpled dollar bill over the collection basket struggling to drop it in thinking about all the things that dollar could buy. Then I am reminded of something Bertrand Russell once wrote: "To be without some of the things you want is an indispensable part of happiness."

Maybe my sacrificial giving is in relation to the time and talent I have been given to work for the dignity and respect of all life from conception to natural death, from injustices that bring about poverty and a lack of respect for religious freedom in our world. Am I generous with my time and talent in working to build the Kingdom of God? The widow's MIGHT (strength) was the widow MITE (smallness), her commitment to give even what little she had to God. Our generosity cannot be outdone. God is at work loving us, giving us what we need to bring forth His dream for our world. We must trust, act in faith and believe that God is bringing all things to the good in God's time and in God's way.

St. Vincent de Paul Food Drive

As part of our Works of Mercy ministry, St. Joe's is collaborating with Emmanuel's St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) to help needy residents in our local geography. Two important ways SVdP is fulfilling this need are the food pantry at Emmanuel Parish and the distribution of food baskets at Thanksgiving and Christmas. The food pantry, which recently has been serving an average of 90 people a month, has at times been critically short on food and other supplies. During the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons, St. Joseph's will be collecting nonperishable food and other items to help feed needy families. Requested items include canned goods, boxed foods, paper products and cleaning supplies. These items can be placed in the red boxes in the back of church.
