## *Pastor's Corner*

The year was 1925. All was quite in the library of Pope Pius XI, quiet, except for the thundering debate that was going on in his mind. You see, up until this point there had not been a separate feast in honor of Christ the King. Some questioned the relevance of such a feast. Yet, as Pius XI looked at the world he couldn't help but see the confusion and misguided direction so prevalent among the people. His inner debate soon took on the form of a prayer.

Lord God, the evil that human society is suffering from is affecting the lives of all its members. People of every social category, young and old alike, are restless and embittered. Where once there was trustfulness and certainty, now there is anxiety and fear.

The orderly calm with which life was lived has gone; instead there is confusion and strife. The spiritual in most places is a mere acting out of ritual with men and women's total energy being spent on trying to get ahead of the other. It seems Lord that your people have not merely turned from you, they have just plain left you out of their lives. Once you are gone the power of the individual, the civil government or the whims of society rise to take command of all.

Our world claims to have many kings, men and women who sit on self-styled thrones of "me-isms", thrones of complacency and thrones of accomplishments forgetting the God who gave them life.

This view of the world that Pius XI saw in 1925 could easily be brought into 2012. It is important that we have a special day each year to remember and celebrate Christ who is King of heaven and earth, a king--not like the old game of king of the hill where you push everyone else off the top. Nor a King that feels they are better than everyone else. Jesus, our King, took the form of a slave—became one like us, giving his life for the salvation of the world. We have a king we can follow. One whose example of peace, justice and love draws us closer to God and to one another.

Today is the last Sunday of the church liturgical year. We have completed another journey that took us through Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and all the Sunday's of Ordinary Time. Next Sunday will be the First Sunday of Advent and the opportunity to begin a new cycle of celebrations that will lead us into a deeper relationship of love with God. May we always turn to Christ our King to guide our way.
