## *Pastor's Corner*

A couple of weeks ago some friends of mine told me that they had agreed to participate in a neighborhood watch group. There had been a noticeable increase in crime in their area and so the neighbors decided that it was time for them to band together to make their neighborhood a safer place and to improve the quality of life. If something does not look right or looks suspicious they make a call for help and become part of the solution to prevent crime.

This is a wonderful image of what the Prophet Ezekiel was called to do as a watchman for the house of Israel. He was to keep watch and to speak out when he encountered trouble. The wicked person was to turn away from his or her wrongdoing. In the same way, each of us as baptized members of the household of God are called to keep watch and to speak out when someone does something we know is wrong.

Sometimes the devil will use the tool of indifference to keep us from speaking out and getting involved. We respond by saying: "Oh, I don't want to get involved, it might ruin our friendship" or "I don't want to cause waves" or "It's not that bad, after all everyone else is doing it." Sins of omission are just as wrong as any other sin. If we fail to speak out against something that we know is wrong then we have become part of the problem.

It is important to keep in mind that fraternal correction must be done with the recognition that I am a sinner speaking to another sinner. My role is not to be the judge. Entering this kind of conversation is not about winning an argument or proving the other person wrong. Our posture is to simply speak the truth in love because that is how God treats us.

As members of God's neighborhood watch group, we have heard the call to get involved, to make a difference, to help one another get back on track when we have sinned. It is difficult to live this call when we are faced with so many challenges in our world. That is why it is important for us to gather in prayer, to support one another, to be nourished with the Body and Blood of Christ and then continue the work of building the Kingdom of God.

### **St. Vincent de Paul Society District Council of Dayton**

Did you know that the St. Vincent de Paul Society is part of an International Organization which serves the local Dayton area through a District Council and 34 local chapters referred to as Conferences? While the work of the Emmanuel St. Vincent de Paul Conference, which is staffed by volunteers from our three Region 7 parishes, cares for the needs of the poor in the 45402 zip code, the Dayton District Council serves over 100,000 people in need in the Miami Valley with faith-based assistance, shelter and hope. Here are some of the ways they serve our community. In 2013, 4,000 homeless men, women and children received nearly 130,000 nights of shelter, 300,000 meals here prepared and 1,400 individuals successful made the transition from shelter to permanent housing.

This month the St. Vincent de Paul Dayton District Council is engaged in a special appeal drive entitled WE TOGETHER to raise awareness regarding the challenges of poverty and homelessness in our community and to seek donations for their ministry of offering assistance, shelter and hope to our brothers and sisters in need. ### **Bicentennial of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood -- 1815--2015**

On August 15, 2015, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood (C.P.P.S.) will celebrate the 200th anniversary of their founding. God has been good to our Community, whose members minister in your parish. During the next year the C.P.P.S. will offer to their parishes a series of bulletin notes that tell the story of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and also explain something about their spirituality and mission. Often, parishioners are served by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood throughout their lives, yet know little about the C.P.P.S. Congregation! We hope that you will find these notes interesting, and maybe learn a little more about the Missionaries who serve your parish.

The Missionaries of the Precious Blood were founded in 1815 by St. Gaspar del Bufalo, a Roman-born priest who was a renowned preacher. St. Gaspar was a high-energy organizer who was on a mission: he wanted to renew the Church and heal the world with the power of the Precious Blood of Jesus. Two hundred years later, his Missionaries—priests, brothers and lay associates—help carry his message, that the Blood of Jesus can energize, unite and save us.
