Pastor's Corner

Each October is set aside by the bishops of the United States as Respect Life Month, a time to particularly reflect on life issues and to pray for and promote greater respect for all human life. This year's theme is "Each of us is a masterpiece of God's creation," adapted from Pope Francis' 2013 Day for Life greeting. In this greeting Pope Francis invites us to imagine ourselves visiting an art museum and pausing in quiet wonder in front of a beautiful piece of art. Consider the artist who created that masterpiece with great care and attention to detail. Each of us is a masterpiece, created by God with purpose and tenderness. We are each loved so intensely by God in a relationship that goes beyond anything we have ever experienced.

By the witness of his life, Pope Francis is showing us that "even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect (*2013 Day for Life Greeting*).

In our gospel reading today, the tenants who were entrusted with the care of the vineyard become violent and decide to kill the servants and the son of the owner of the vineyard thinking they would then take possession the vineyard. They had forgotten that they were simply stewards of the vineyard. Each of us has been entrusted with a portion of God's vineyard, to care for it, working to produce an abundant harvest. What will you do with the vineyard that has been entrusted to you?

We are each called to witness, in our own way, to the powerful and life-transforming love of Christ and to offer the respect and reverence that is due each person as a "masterpiece of God's creation." As Cardinal O'Malley reminds us, "We must ask the Lord for the grace to see ourselves and others as he sees us—as masterpieces of his creation. Our mission is to show each person the love of Christ. We are continually given opportunities to do so in our interactions with the cashier at the grocery store, our spouses, children, friends and even the people we encounter in traffic. Each of these moments is valuable beyond our realization. We may never know how much a simple gesture of compassion may affect someone's life."

Building a culture of life is challenging and must begin in the heart of each person. We must continually be engaged in the work of transforming our own lives so that we can transform the world around us. St. Paul offers us a helpful guide, "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things and put them into practice. Then the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4:8-9) Fr. Angelo
