Pastor's Corner

For the next several months you will be hearing a lot about two important projects within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. At the end of January we will be invited to make our pledge in support of the annual Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). This years' goal for the CMA is \$5 million dollars. Gifts to the CMA support six critical shared ministries of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati: 1) Seminary and Vocations, 2) Catholic Charities and Social Services, 3) Campus, Hospital, and Prison Ministries, 4) Retired Archdiocesan Priests, 5) St. Rita School for the Deaf and 6) New Evangelization. Through these ministries the 213 parishes of the archdiocese are able to do so much more than one parish can do alone.

In February and March we will be introduced to the Archdiocesan Capital Campaign entitled "One Faith, One Hope, One Love." The last time the Archdiocese embarked upon a capital campaign was back in 1955 during the time of Archbishop Alter. As the Archdiocese of Cincinnati draws near to its Bicentennial in 2021 we are committed, more than ever, to meeting the needs of our people and our community that number over 480,000 Catholics. At this moment in our history, sustaining and growing our diocesan ministries requires attention to several key priorities. We must foster strong parish communities, the driving force of our call to be Christ's presence in the world. We must ensure the continued availability and strength of our Catholic schools. We cannot forsake our brothers and sisters in need. We must continue to welcome and foster the rising numbers of priestly vocations God is sending us, while we provide for our retired priests in gratitude for their lives of dedicated service.

The goal of the "One Faith, One Hope, One Love" Capital Campaign is to raise \$130 Million dollars over a five-year pledge period. The campaign goal is divided into five categories: 1) Catholic School Education (programming and tuition assistance)-50%, 2) Local Parish Priorities-26%, 3) Fostering Vocations-12%, 4) Caring for Retired Diocesan Priests-10% and 5) Catholic Charities & Social Services (to expand services to the needy and vulnerable)-8%. Each parish will be given a goal based upon 120% of the annual offertory given over the 2012-2013 fiscal year.

Many have asked the question, "How or why is the archdiocese running the CMA in the midst of the One Faith, One Hope, One Love Campaign?" The simplest answer...because the ministries supported by the CMA depend on the Appeal every year to help fund operating needs and continue their great work. Someone from the Archdiocesan Stewardship Office made this observation when speaking about the CMA in relation to the Capital Campaign, "Every year you make payments on your house, but every 20 or so years you need to replace the roof."

The time has come for the archdiocese to make a decisive step for the future of the Catholic Church in Southwest Ohio and we are being asked to help make a significant contribution to the future just as our ancestors did who built the churches we worship in today. It was through their sacrificial giving that what we enjoy today was made possible. It is our turn to make a significant contribution for the future growth and strength of the Catholic Church in our day.

During the next several months you will be learning more about the CMA and the "One Faith, One Hope, One Love Campaign." The gifts, talents and resources that God has given to us are meant to be shared for the building of the Kingdom of God. With grateful hearts may we return to the Lord what we have received, allowing His light to shine through us to those most in need.
