Life is a precious gift, but as we live an abundant life we also need to be mindful of end of life issues. In these days of ever developing medical advances there are many things that need to be considered. It is important to understand many of the processes of treating advanced disease and end of life conditions as essential to making decisions. Some of the tools to allow us to communicate our wishes when we can no longer speak for ourselves include a Health Care Power of Attorney and/or a Living Will. It is also important to know the meaning and purpose of a Do Not Resuscitate Order.

Join us on Saturday, April 18, 2015 at 3:00 pm in the school cafeteria at St. Joseph to learn more about these issues. S. Carol Bauer, SC, Vice-President of Mission Effectiveness at Good Samaritan Hospital will provide insight on this topic and discuss the legal documents available in Ohio to express your wishes regarding end of life care. 

Pastor's Corner

Our gospel reading for the celebration of Easter Sunday begins with the words: “On the first day of the week...” St. John doesn’t simply say “the next day,” or “the day after the Sabbath,” or “Sunday.” He is making a point and signaling that something new has happened. The first day of the week takes us back to the dawn of creation when God created light to separate the day; God’s creative hand breaks the darkness and creates light.

On that first Easter morning God broke the darkness of sin and death forever!
When we think something is impossible—God says: “All things are possible.”
When we are afraid or alone—God says: “Fear not—I am with you.”
When we say “I can’t forgive”—God says: “I forgive you.”
When we think “I don’t have enough faith”—God says: “My grace is enough for you.”



Our Lenten journey has brought us to this holiest of weeks, a journey which has challenged us to place Jesus Christ at the center of our lives so that we might enflesh his values, priorities and love. The season of Lent began with a call for repentance and conversion. As Msgr. John McIlhon has stated: *"Repentance is a profound change of mind. Conversion is a profound change of heart. When repentance journeys to the heart, there takes place a change of life. Repentance cries out, 'I meant what I said.' Conversion cries out, 'I have become what I meant!'"* When we renew our Baptismal promises this Easter let us boldly profess what we believe and celebrate what we have become in Christ.

Throughout the Easter season I invite you to take to heart the words of Vince Ambrosetti: *"Blessed are we who hear the word of God, who hear the word of God and keep it. Let us then receive what we now hear, believe what we receive and become what we believe."* Fr. Ken and I pray that this Easter season may be filled with many experiences of the Risen Lord present in our world today!

The objectives of this portion of the campaign includes endowments and immediate needs. 1) A tuition fund for needs-based assistance, used in concert with available tuition assistance and a proportionate and reasonable family sacrifice. 2) Professional training, faith formation, and leadership development for teachers and administrators, including catechists in parish religious education programs throughout our archdiocese. 3) Programs that foster quality and vitality in our schools, such as innovative marketing efforts, Latino outreach, and new methods of data collection and accountability.

The Missionaries of the Precious Blood, who celebrate 200 years as a religious congregation this year, were founded by St. Gaspar del Bufalo in Italy in 1815. Saint Gaspar often quoted a verse from Psalm 30: "What profit is there in my blood?" He interpreted this as meaning that the immense gift of salvation gained by the Blood of Jesus was being ignored by sinners, or in his words, that it was being "abused." His preaching ministry was aimed at helping people to become more aware of the gift of God's mercy. His understanding of the mystery of the Precious Blood echoes the words of Saint Paul in Romans: "...do you hold priceless [God's] kindness, forbearance, and patience in low esteem, unaware that the kindness of God would lead you to repentance?" (Romans 2:4).
