Pastor's Corner

Seldom do we experience the large gushing winds of Pentecost as described in our reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Usually the Holy Spirit will work in little gusts that can change our life a little at a time. Unfortunately, we often brush these invitations for transformation aside either because we're too busy or we're preoccupied with our own agendas. For example, I can experience the Holy Spirit in the extra pause I give while reading a magazine and find myself touched by the plight of the homeless or the loss that comes with another victim of violence.

That sudden pause over something that catches our eye or the voice inside of us that leaves us pondering is often the breath of the Holy Spirit seeking to move us into action.

- ◆ Maybe it is an invitation to check the way I am treating others or asking myself if my behavior contributes to a culture of violence.
- ◆ Maybe it is the sight of an amazing sunset that leaves us speechless and we become aware of the beauty of God at work in creation. This experience leaves us wondering if we are good stewards of God's creation.
- ◆ Maybe a chance line on a sign or a quote we read sticks with us and it becomes the mantra we hold onto for the day or throughout a challenging time in life.

I think of one experience I had while visiting a church near Gloucester, MA. In the back of the church I saw a poster which said, "The life of every human being first began in the heart of God." This line stayed with me the rest of the week and became a source of reflection for me as I wrestled with some challenging relationships.

As I left the church and began walking around the neighborhood I noticed that many of the houses were in one stage of repair or another. Reflecting upon the experience I heard God calling me to repair a relationship that had gone sour. Just as buildings need upkeep and maintenance, so too does the human heart.

This week is a good time to pray with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and to choose one of the gifts to be poured into your heart this Pentecost season. And so we pray...

Spirit of Wisdom, preside over all my thoughts, words and actions, so that in all things I try to see as God sees, choosing to love God above all things.

Spirit of Understanding, teach and enlighten me to be less in control, so that I may humble myself and be more attentive to the needs of others thus enjoying true peace of mind and heart.

Spirit of Knowledge, teach me how to look at things in their true light, so that I may not be bound by earthly attachments, but ever rejoice in Your heavenly comforts.

Spirit of Counsel/Right Judgment, grant that I may always seek Your guidance, that my thoughts and actions may be informed by good judgment, and that whenever my advice is sought by others it will be offered with kindness, prudence, truth and in accordance with God's will.

Spirit of Fortitude/Courage, strengthen my weakness, so that I may never be discouraged by obstacles in the path of holiness and virtue, but may willingly accept the trials and difficulties of this life.

Spirit of Piety/Reverence, place within my soul familial love toward God my heavenly Father, and all my brothers and sisters, so that I may delight in the service of God and neighbor.

Spirit of Holy Fear/Wonder & Awe, keep me mindful of the infinite majesty of God, recognizing that I am a temple of God's Spirit keep me from all selfish desires and evil actions, that I may humbly serve God and others with a clean heart and clear mind.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.
