## Pastor's Corner

One of the first Catholic gestures that we learn is the sign of the cross. This ritual is a constant reminder to us of our belief in the Holy Trinity; God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We begin our prayers with the affirmation that God is one and three and the realization that we share in the relationship of love that is found in the life of the Trinity.

St. Paul reminds us in his Letter to the Romans that we “*did not receive a spirit of slavery...but a Spirit of adoption.*” It’s important to remember that the Greek and Roman empire of Paul’s time was based on an economy of slavery. So, for Paul to say that the people are children of God rather than slaves...it was certainly Good News! And because we are children of God we are heirs of God, sharing in the relationship of love that is found between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The beauty of today’s feast reminds us that our God is a saving God. God the Father sent his Son Jesus in union with the Holy Spirit so that we might participate in the life of God forever. The foundation of this life we share in Christ is LOVE. The mystery of this truth was not something revealed all at once, but over time.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity--of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reminds us that the face of God is most clearly revealed in diversity. There is no one way to describe who God IS and to focus on just one person of the Trinity is to miss the richness of this mystery. Recognizing this truth helps us to appreciate and celebrate the diversity that is found in community.

In some ways, today’s reading sounds like another resurrection appearance. “Jesus appears to the disciples; they realize it is he and worship him—but they doubted.” That little line “but they doubted” gives me hope and encouragement in my response to the commission of Jesus. It reminds me that the disciples didn’t have everything together and yet Jesus pushed them out of the nest, with the reassuring words: “*I am with you always, until the end of the age.*” This promise continues for each of us. Whatever we offer in the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit...we can be assured that God is with us!


### *Precious Blood Bicentennial, August 15, 2015*

## *St. Joseph Parish Surpasses Goal!*

I am very pleased to announce the successful completion of the Archdiocesan Capital Campaign for St. Joseph Catholic Church. To date the parish has raised \$447,361 which is 110% of our goal! This means that approximately \$106,200 will come back to our parish over the next five years as the pledges are paid. We will use these


funds to set up a maintenance fund to care for future maintenance needs for our beautiful church and support some future faith formation programs. 118 households within the parish made a pledge to the campaign.

Thus far the overall campaign effort has raise 72 million dollars toward the total goal of 130 million dollars. These funds will be used to help address needs in the following areas: Catholic Education, Fostering Vocations, Caring for Retired Diocesan Priests, Catholic Charities and Social Services and providing support for Local Parish Priorities. Please continue to pray for the success of the campaign as another Block of parishes begins their efforts this summer and a final Block in the fall.
