From June 21 to July 4, the U.S. Catholic bishops are once again recognizing a "Fortnight for Freedom" to draw special attention to current threats to religious liberty. As we approach the celebration of the birth of

our nation, people of faith are encouraged to remember that our nation's founders embraced freedom of religion as an essential condition of a free and democratic society. They enshrined this vision in the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights, which guarantees that "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." This has meant that churches and religious institutions are not only free to worship in their own way, but they are also free to exercise ministries of education, charity and social justice that reflect their fundamental beliefs and serve all people, regardless of faith, economic position, or immigration status. Pastor's Corner

The Feast of the Precious Blood is celebrated on July 1st. Since this feast is a solemnity for the Missionaries of the Precious Blood we have permission to celebrate the feast at our ministry sites on the Sunday closest to the feast. The origin of this feast as we know it today goes back to the Church of St. Nicholas in Chains in Rome which has a relic of the Passion donated to the church by the Savelli family in 1708. Fr. Francesco Albertini instituted a religious association dedicated to the Precious Blood there in 1808. It was inaugurated with the preaching of his friend, Fr. Gaspar del Bufalo, "the greatest apostle of the Blood of Christ" (St. John XXIII), who founded the congregation of the Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood on August 15, 1815.

Fr. Robert Schreiter notes that, "The foundation of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in 1815 was a direct outcome of a project by Pope Pius VII to restore the spiritual and social life of the Papal States after the devastation brought about by Napoleon's occupation. This program, inaugurated by Pius VII and continued up to the beginning of the reign of Pius IX in 1846, is usually called by historians "the Restoration." What it was trying to restore was the faith and morals of Catholics in the Papal States, as well as bring about the reform of the clergy. Many priest and laity had fallen away from the church to follow Napoleon and they needed to be reconciled with the church."

"In the spirituality of the blood of Christ, the blood of the covenant finds its meaning today in acts of solidarity and renewal with those who are excluded, oppressed or alienated. It is an invitation to belonging, for those who find themselves at the margins of society for whatever reason (race, class, gender, ethnic origin, or whatever). It also speaks to the loneliness, lack of self-esteem, and anxiety of individuals in society. Under the impulse of the teaching of Pope John Paul II in his encyclical *Evangelium vitae*, the blood of Christ speaks to the dignity of each human person, and the protection of life in all its stages—from conception to death—and to the creation of what he calls a "culture of life." Some of these themes are echoed in the new encyclical by Pope Francis on the care of our earth home.

The spirituality of the Precious Blood is needed now more than ever to respond to the lack of respect for life in our culture and the need to draw people back to the faith, those who have wandered morally and spiritually from the Lord. This week thousands of people dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus will be gathered in Rome to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of our congregation. May we be united with them in proclaiming the joyful message of St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, "Those who are far off have been brought near through the Blood of Christ." (Eph. 2:13)
