# Happy Independence Day

#### The Missionaries of the Precious Blood,

who celebrate 200 years as a religious congregation this year, were founded by St. Gaspar del Bufalo in Italy in 1815. Not all was sweetness and light among the earliest members of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Saint Gaspar met with a lot of opposition from a member who was otherwise very dedicated, Don (Father) Innocenzo Betti. The issue was over the religious garb of the lay brothers. Betti didn't think that they should wear the cassock, since

they would be running errands and doing the shopping while wearing it, thus, according to Betti, bringing disrespect to the garb. Gaspar replied: "to put it plainly, it is not the work that makes one deny or oppose the dignity of the habit, but other things: useless chatter...theaters, etc." Eventually Gaspar decided that the correspondence with Don Innocenzo was not going anywhere, so he wrote: "let us remain in the Heart of Jesus Christ. May peace and concord reign in us; and since you stated that you have suffered anguish because of me, do not have any doubts, you will not receive any more letters from me, for, I repeat, they are useless. By different roads, we shall see each other again in Paradise." O Lord, let us, like St. Gaspar, know when to agree to disagree gracefully with our brothers and sisters in faith!

# Pastor's Corner

God does not leave us when we sin or when we are weak. In today's scripture passage Paul speaks of having "a thorn in the flesh" something he begged the Lord to remove from his life at three different times. The Lord responded, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." We are called to embrace the thorn, the hole in the soul and place it in the ocean of God's mercy. Our weakness and brokenness in life reminds us that all power comes from God. He looks upon us as His treasure, not a perfect treasure, but one that is always seeking to be drawn into a deeper relationship of love. What is the hole in your soul...that place of pain and brokenness? Rather than trying to ignore it or cover it up, turn it over to the Lord and let God fill what is lacking.



Reflecting upon the Fortnight of Freedom we finish on July 4th I recall a quote from C.S. Lewis in which he noted that we live in a society that has replaced "I believe," with "I feel." Lewis observed that we live in a society where personal values have replaced objective morality. Maybe you have heard it said: "I have my truth and you have your truth." Yet, Truth is not what (you and I) say it is. No, we believe there is one Truth, namely Jesus Christ. It takes humility to realize that there is a higher authority that keeps us from rationalizing everything away. This is one of the dangers we live with in society today. There is an attitude which says nothing has meaning unless I give it meaning. This is particularly true in relation to the recent ruling on same-sex marriage. Please take some time to reflect upon today's bulletin insert as we work together to promote the sanctity of marriage defined as the union of one man and one woman.

Basic to our way of living in this country is the right to religious liberty. For our actions and intentions are formed by our belief in Jesus Christ. As efforts in our culture are being made to construct a more secularized type of religion it is becoming more and more challenging to be engaged in the work of Jesus outside a church building. And yet, that is precisely where we've always been. The gospels show us that most of the work of Jesus was done outside the Temple or Synagogue. In imitation of Jesus the church stands with the poor, the homeless, the illiterate, the poor, the marginalized and the outcasts; the church has set up hospitals, schools, orphanages, outreach center to respond to these needs. And we have a right to practice our beliefs and to have our beliefs respected in these settings. We're involved in these ministries not just to help other Catholics but because we are catholic we can see Jesus in everyone we meet and the gospel motivates us to reach out in love to those in need.

# Fortnight for Freedom

"In the opening chapter of *Declaration on Religious Liberty*, the Council Fathers at Vatican II forthrightly declared that "the human person has a right to religious freedom." This right is founded upon the intrinsic dignity of the human person. From God's revelation we know that the dignity of human beings resides in their being created in the image and likeness of God (Gn 1:27). Like God we are intelligent beings with free will. Because of this we can know the truth and perform God-like actions, such as being loving, kind, forgiving, etc. Reason itself in knowing what a human being is, confirms that we possess a dignity and worth that exceeds the rest of creation and that cannot be violated, but rather needs to be protected and fostered. Religious belief lies at the very center of who we are in relation to what is most central and cherished in our lives. Therefore, the

Council insists that the religious convictions of individuals or groups should never be coerced but must be held freely, protected by a civil constitutional right."
