Gaspar must have run his life by the maxim attributed to the architect Mies van der Rohe, "God is in the detail." The Founder seems to have had his finger on the activities of all of the mission houses. An example of this is his concern about the proposed sale of acorns of a certain mission house to some of the local people. Gaspar opposed this, citing the difficulty in collecting the money from them in the past, and then proposed that the house obtain some piglets to feed on the acorns, even specifying the type of pig to be purchased. He also had to deal with the issue of having cats around in the houses, expressly forbidding that they be fed in the dining room. May God grant us attention to the details of our parish life, so that we build a good home for our faith family!

Pastor's Corner

God calls each of us to a life of discipleship, to a life of mission.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus calls the Twelve; he instructs them; he gives them authority; he sends them out two by two to preach, to teach, to cure, and to forgive.

In the same way each of us is called, by our baptism, called to holiness, called for a special mission. However, it is not easy to follow through, to be Christ's words, hands, and feet in this challenging world. We all too often fall short, sometimes our words are cruel, sometimes our actions cause pain to others, and sometimes our feet travel to harmful places.



There are those times that answering God's call will lead to rejection; that happened to Amos, to St. Paul, the Apostles, to Jesus. During these times it's so important to remember that God loves us. He loves you, forgives you, blesses you, and has a plan for you. You are God's adopted son, adopted daughter and can live with God's grace and blessing.

God has a plan for our lives. He loves us. He will stay with us during trials and struggles. He will pour down his healing mercy. He had redeemed us by the blood of his only-begotten son, Jesus, shed on the cross out of love for us, to save us from sin and death. Keep saying "yes" to God's call. Be like Amos, St. Paul, the Apostles and Jesus, and keep saying "yes" to our Father in heaven.

Psalm 139 gives us courage to follow God's call and be a disciple of Jesus.

"O Lord, you search me and you know me. You yourself know my resting and my rising, you discern my thoughts from afar. You mark when I walk or lie down; you know all my ways through and through. For it was you who formed my inmost being, knit me together in my mother's womb.

I thank you who wonderfully made me; how wonderful are your works, which my soul knows well! O search me, God, and know my heart. O test me, and know my thoughts. See that my path is not wicked, and lead me in the way everlasting."

Fortnight for Freedom

"In the opening chapter of *Declaration on Religious Liberty*, the Council Fathers at Vatican II forthrightly declared that "the human person has a right to religious freedom." This right is founded upon the intrinsic dignity of the human person. From God's revelation we know that the dignity of human beings resides in their being created in the image and likeness of God (Gn 1:27). Like God we are intelligent beings with free will. Because of this we can know the truth and perform God-like actions, such as being loving, kind, forgiving, etc. Reason itself in knowing what a human being is, confirms that we possess a dignity and worth that exceeds the rest of creation and that cannot be violated, but rather needs to be protected and fostered. Religious belief lies at the very center of who we are in relation to what is most central and cherished in our lives. Therefore, the Council insists that the religious convictions of individuals or groups should never

be coerced but must be held freely, protected by a civil constitutional right."
