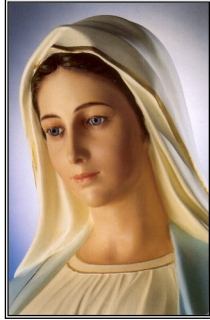

## Pastor's Corner

One question that comes to mind in light of our gospel today is "When is enough...enough?" In today's world there is an underlining belief that you can buy happiness, that somehow you are less a person if you do not have the latest gadget. In many ways our culture values wealth and material goods above all else.

One way to measure our attachment to material things is to ask, would my basic attitude toward life be affected if I lost this earthly thing? This is important because what so easily develops in life is a kind of competition between our possessions and our attention to God. What comes first in your life? Is it your job, your family, your hobby, Facebook time, the internet, sports or travel? What does your credit or debit card statement or internet search archive point to as your priorities in life? These may be barriers keeping you from developing a stronger relationship with God.

Whenever I hear this gospel story I ask myself, "I wonder what happened to the young man." Did he give up on his search for everlasting life? Did he go off for a time—only to be drawn back to Jesus at a later time? Did he go on to use his wealth and power to help others like King Solomon of old?

St. Mark tells us that "Jesus looked at him and loved him." I imagine that some people looked at the rich young man with envy, others with admiration and still others with disappointment. Jesus looked at him with love, not judgment. Jesus could see beyond his wealth and scholarly knowledge and found the wrestled heart of a young man who sensed something was missing in life. I like to think that the look of love Jesus gave to him became a lasting memory for the young man and that eventually the memory of that look of love melted the young man's heart and he returned to walk once again with Jesus.

Today Jesus looks lovingly at us. Is there anything in your life that is acting as a roadblock to your ability to say "yes" to the Lord? Each time you come forward for communion, imagine Jesus looking at you with love. Allow His love to fill whatever is lacking or troubling in your life, put aside the barriers, and then follow Him.
