Pastor's Corner

We end the Church Year with the Feast of Christ the King. We have finished our journey through Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and all those Sundays in Ordinary time. Next Sunday will be the First Sunday in Advent, and we will begin a new journey through the birth, preaching and miracles of Jesus as well as his passion, death and resurrection.

Since many of us have never had contact with an actual king, we can't help but draw our images from storybooks, plays and movies. We imagine a king living in a castle, guarded by knights in armor, being waited on hand and foot as he sits in his gilded chair. And yet, Jesus gave new meaning to the title of King. He did not come among us seeking honor or glory but rather, he came to make his home in our hearts.

Christ came into the world to save us, to offer us the gift of eternal life. Our Gospel today shows Pilate and Jesus in dialogue with one another about authority and kingship. Pilate is thinking about political and military power, but Jesus has taught that the only true and lasting power on earth is unselfish love. He says that his kingdom is not of this world. We who share this vision of God's kingdom are to continue the mission of Jesus by reaching out to the least and the lost, to love as Jesus loved.

When we recognize the great gift of salvation we have been given through the Precious Blood of Jesus our hearts cannot help but be filled with gratitude and thanksgiving. It's helpful to note that gratitude is a feeling of appreciation and thanksgiving is putting that feeling of gratitude into action by giving thanks. In the parable of the ten lepers who are cleansed, they were all grateful for their healing, but only one of them came back to give thanks. It is not enough to feel gratitude; we must also acknowledge the gift and the giver of the gift. This Thanksgiving season how will you turn your feelings of gratitude into an action of thanksgiving? How will you express your gratitude to God in an act of thanksgiving?
