PASTOR'S PEN...

Our readings today highlight the importance of hospitality. As we prepare to celebrate the Solemnity of Christmas we anticipate that there will be some new faces in the congregation. Please reach out to any stranger, welcome them to our parish church and encourage them to find a home with us.

Fr. Heni Nouwen finds great meaning in Mary's visit to Elizabeth because these two women gathered in hope and enable each other to wait. "Mary's visit made Elizabeth aware of what she was waiting for. The child leapt for joy in her. Mary affirmed Elizabeth's waiting. These two women created space for each other to wait. They affirmed for each other that something was happening that was worth waiting for."

Nouwen continues, "I think that is the model of the Christian community. It is a community of support, celebration, and affirmation in which we can lift up what has already begun in us. The visit of Elizabeth and Mary is one of the Bible's most beautiful expressions of what it means to form community, to be together, gathered around a promise, affirming that something is really happening." As one poet says, "Love came down at Christmas." By this saving act we know ourselves to be loved and we in turn are impelled to share that love with others. Perry Como said it well in his song The Christmas Feeling. "Christmas helps you to remember, to do what other folks hold dear-what a blessed place the world would be, if we had the Christmas feelin' all year!"

In this Christmas season as we celebrate the gift of life given to us in Jesus, the Word made Flesh, may we reverence the gift of life in all people and build a community of faith rooted in the love of God always holding in our hearts the gift of Christmas which is love.
