PASTOR'S PEN...

The Scriptures remind us today of what kind of family we are, and how we are called to live as the family of Christ every day. In today's first reading, the prophet Isaiah describes the wonderful difference that being a part of this family makes. As an individual and as a community, we are never abandoned or alone. We are not called to keep God's love hidden, but to share it with everyone. Living as a family-in our homes and as a Church—is a powerful witness to God's wondrous deeds. Certainly we know that so much of our world is in real need of hope, and our vocation to be Christ's family may seem daunting. We may believe that we lack the resources or the power to make a difference. But that is why we must pay special attention to today's account of the miracle at Cana, from the Gospel of St. John. The first public miracle of Jesus demonstrating "God's wondrous deeds" is found at the joyful occasion of a wedding. At this particular wedding the wine runs out. Mary asks her Son to do something about it. As a sign of God's powerful, transforming love, Jesus changes ordinary water into an overflowing abundance of the finest wine.

That is what God calls us to do as his family, for his family. We are to use the ordinary water of our own resources to pour out joy, healing, and transformation to a world in need. We are called to share our blessings and change lives. We need only be like the servants at the Cana wedding feast, following Mary's instructions: "Do whatever he tells you."

Jesus tells us, his family, to feed the hungry, to heal the sick, to visit the imprisoned and to shelter the homeless. Here in our Archdiocese we are responding to these corporal works of mercy through the ministries funded by the Catholic Ministries Appeal. We are most effective in responding to these needs when we work together as a family. Alone, we are just ordinary water. In Christ, we are the wine of hope and resurrection, poured out and shared in abundance.

Through the Catholic ministries Appeal, which begins today, we do much more than simply pledge our financial support. We actually participate in these ministries; we ourselves are feeding, teaching, and healing people in need who are a part of the family of the Archdiocese.

In his Letter to the Corinthians St. Paul reminds us that we have been given all that we have for a purpose. "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone." May God strengthen and bless us all as we glorify God and serve Christ by sharing our blessings and changing lives through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Year of Mercy

Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life. All of her pastoral activity should be caught up in the tenderness she makes present to believers; nothing in her preaching and in her witness to the world can be lacking in mercy. The Church's very credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love. Perhaps we have long since forgotten how to show and live the way of mercy. The temptation, on the one hand, to focus exclusively on justice made us forget that this is only the first, albeit necessary and indispensable step. But the Church needs to go beyond and strive for a higher and more important goal. On the other hand, sad to say, we must admit that the practice of mercy is waning in the wider culture. In some cases the word seems to have dropped out of use. However, without a witness to mercy, life becomes fruitless and sterile, as if sequestered in a barren desert. The time has come for the Church to take up the joyful call to mercy once more.
