PASTOR'S PEN...

On this second Sunday of Lent we are given a vision of Jesus that puts us in touch with his divinity as he is transfigured. The presence of God was so strong that "his face had changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white." (Luke 9:29) The transfiguration that the disciples experienced gave them an insight as to what will be when the fullness of God's Kingdom comes to light and that they too could one day share in Christ's glory.

The same is true for us! At the time of our baptism we received the Light of Christ, symbolized by a lighted candle taken from the paschal candle, the Christ candle, and we were given the mission to keep the flame of faith alive in our hearts. This call can be very challenging as we see in the life of Jesus. He experienced the pain of betrayal, the failure of his plans, the pain of crucifixion and the darkness of death. Jesus teaches us that there is no way to avoid the cross of suffering. If there were another way he would have shown us. To help strengthen us along the journey of life, we are given glimpses of God's glory in this life that helps us to remain strong in the face of the cross.

All of our life we are in a process of transformation. Like Abram who later become Abraham. Try as he might, Abram could not understand how God would fulfill his promise to provide Abram a son even though God had just protected him from four hostile kings. No matter how many times God has responded to our needs we have difficulty trusting God in the present circumstance in life that is troubling us. Our hearts need to be transformed in such a way that we truly believe that God will never abandon us. Like the Philippians, we must recognize that our citizenship is in heaven and that God desires for us to be with him for all eternity.

Today we are reminded that we are glory bound! We have hope because of our faith in the Risen lord. We have hope because Jesus has given us a vision of what will be. We catch glimpses of this glory at baptisms, weddings, in the beauty of nature, and through the example of saintly people who let the light of Christ shine through them. We find hope in the "future life" we share today as we gather at the table of the Lord, the banquet feast of heaven, to receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

Through our Lenten journey we seek to discover those areas in our life that have become stumbling blocks to our commitment to trust in God; things like negative thinking, cynicism, pride, unforgiveness, patterns of lying or gossip, poor self-esteem, addictive behavior or selfishness. Through the sacrament of reconciliation, receiving the Eucharist, through times of sacrifice and prayer, through spiritual reading and the support of a loving relationship we can find the strength we need to be transformed and to place our trust in God.

Year of Mercy...In this Holy Year, we look forward to the experience of opening our hearts to those living on the outermost fringes of society: fringes which modern society itself creates. How many uncertain and painful situations there are in the world today! How many are the wounds borne by the flesh of those who have no voice because their cry is muffled and drowned out by the indifference of the rich! During this Jubilee, the Church will be called even more to heal these wounds, to assuage them with the oil of consolation, to bind them with

mercy and cure them with solidarity and vigilant care.

Corporal Work of Mercy: Cloth the Naked

Do you remember St. Martin of Tours? Martin was a soldier who encountered a beggar near the city gate. Seeing he was cold, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave half his cloak to the beggar. That night, Christ appears to Martin wearing half the cloak. Jan Reed at Holy Trinity witnessed a similar event at Christmas time. A young woman was begging at the exit of Keowee St. and Route 35. Seeing she was lightly clothed, a big burly man got out of his car, took his overcoat off and gave it to the woman and then drove off. Do we see the poor and needy or do we look past them pretending not to see? Clothing the naked can be as simple as sharing some of the clothes you have stacked up in your closet with St. Vincent or Good Will. Clothing the naked can mean reaching out to someone who is unloved, uncared for, unwanted and clothing them with love. Clothing the naked can mean reaching out to someone who has been stripped of their reputation by gossip. Nakedness signals that something is out of order. We who have put on Christ through the waters of Baptism are called to restore that lost order. How can you restore dignity and cover the nakedness of someone in need?
