PASTOR'S PEN...

For the next three weeks our readings will focus upon the call to repentance. In this season of Lent we hear the call to return to the Lord with all our heart. In small and seemingly insignificant ways we stray from the way of the Lord and can easily find ourselves in a web of sin that keeps us from responding fully to God's call in our life.

This is the heart of the parable Jesus offers in our gospel reading this weekend. The owner of an orchard planted a fig tree with the expectation that the tree would produce fruit. The tree is mature enough and ought to be bearing fruit, but so far none is to be found. We use sayings to describe this reality in human beings like they are apathetic, a couch potato, someone just putting in time, vegetating or standing along the sidelines of life. We were not created to simply take up space here on earth! God desires for us to bear fruit, to be living signs of his presence in the world.

Moses is one such example. God had great plans for him, but after he killed the Egyptian who was hurting a Hebrew person, Moses fled to the desert of Midian to live a hidden life. Speaking through a burning bush that was not consumed, God calls Moses and Moses responds "Here I am." Now Moses is in a relationship with God and the fire of God's presence works to ignite a call within the heart of Moses to save God's people who are suffering in Egypt. Moses objects to God's call five times even after seeing the miraculous burning bush! Finally, Moses overcomes his complacency and slothfulness and accepts God's call and mission.

We have something greater than a burning bush to wake us from our sleepy existence. When we gather for the Eucharist we are in the presence of the Living God, we stand on holy ground. This awareness ought to wake us from our sleep, throw us off the couch and put us in the game of life using the gifts and talents God has given us to bring His life, love and truth to others. This Lent, God is cultivating and fertilizing our lives with the spiritual practices of fasting, prayer and almsgiving. In what ways will you repent of your sin, give of yourself in loving service and bear abundant fruit through your life?

Year of Mercy... In this Holy Year of Mercy, let us not fall into humiliating indifference or a monotonous routine that prevents us from discovering what is new. Let us ward off destructive cynicism! Let us open our eyes to see the misery of the world, the wounds of our brothers and sisters who are denied their dignity, and let us recognize that we are compelled to heed their cry for help! May we reach out to them and support them so they can feel the warmth of our presence, our friendship, and our fraternity. May their cry become our own, and together may we break down the barriers of indifference that too often reign supreme and mask our hypocrisy and egoism.

Welcoming the stranger is also seen in the Emmaus story as the two disciples going away from Jerusalem welcome the stranger to stay with them and in the breaking of the bread they recognized him as Jesus. As we read in the Letter to the Hebrews 13:2 "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." Opening the door of our heart to shelter someone in need means that I see my brother or sister in the face of each person I meet and treat them with the dignity deserving a child of God.
