PASTOR'S PEN...

St. Paul uses the image of an ambassador in his Second Letter to the Corinthians to describe the kind of mission we have been given as followers of Christ. An ambassador is a person sent from a country as an official representative to a foreign country. St. Paul reminds us that our citizenship is in heaven and so we have been commissioned by reason of our baptism to be ambassadors for Christ to proclaim the message of God's reconciling love. As Christ reconciled the world to himself through the shedding of His Precious Blood we too are called to continue this ministry of reconciliation.

In our gospel reading this weekend Jesus offers us a wonderful image of someone acting as an ambassador of Christ with the parable of the prodigal son. So often we focus on the sinful choices of the younger son when we reflect on this parable, but I would like to focus our attention in the direction of the father. He is the ambassador for Christ. He is the one sharing the ministry of reconciliation as a missionary of mercy.

In the parable the younger son rejects his home, family and community. He basically says, "Dad, I don't want to wait until you are dead to start living my life my way. Give me my inheritance now." All too soon the younger son has blown his money and is starving. He finally comes to his senses and heads home. As an ambassador of reconciliation, the father does not condemn his son or compare him to his older brother. With a heart full of mercy he runs out to meet his son and welcomes him home.

The older more dutiful son who has done everything right is angry with his father's decision to throw a banquet for the irresponsible younger son. He turns his back on his father and passes judgment on both the younger son and the father. Even though he has stayed home and worked all this time he has wandered far from any understanding of what it means to be family. Again, the father with a heart full of mercy takes on the role of ambassador and goes out to his son and tries to help him see that there is cause for joy. His brother was dead, but has come back to life!

As we continue our Lenten journey I invite you to see yourself as an ambassador for Christ by reflecting the face of Christ and his gift of mercy to all those you meet. Recognizing that our citizenship is in heaven we will have the courage and strength we need to continue the mission of Jesus by being missionaries of mercy and building the Kingdom of God on earth.

Day of Mercy, March 15th

Immerse yourself in the Father's mercy. Corporal Works of Mercy: Visit the Sick

Jesus often reached out in love to those who were sick in mind, body or spirit restoring order to life. When we visit the sick we are honoring the dignity that is found in that person as a child of God. "Illness and suffering have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life. In illness, humanity experiences his powerlessness, his limitations, and his finitude. Every illness can make us glimpse death" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1500). This corporal work of mercy costs you nothing and does not require a special skill or training. You do not have to worry about what you are going to say because your presence is what is most important along with a listening ear. We do not have to look very far to find someone who is sick or lonely, sometimes they are right in our own home. A friendly visit to someone in the nursing home or to someone living alone down the street will bring healing and new life. In visiting the sick we let the person know that they are not alone, that God's healing love will be at work in their lives because God is full of mercy and compassion.

Vocation Retreat

Pope Francis has declared this the Year of Mercy. Does the call to the consecrated life speak to you, or to someone you know? Young men who would like to learn more about the consecrated life as a priest or a brother are invited to a vocation discernment retreat sponsored by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood on March 11-13 at St. Charles Center in Carthagena, Ohio. This retreat is open to men who have graduated from high school and are of college age or older. It begins with dinner on Friday and ends after lunch on Sunday, and will include times of prayer, presentations, and an exploration of community life with the Missionaries.
