PASTOR'S PEN...

Today we begin Holy Week with the triumphal entrance of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. We join our voices to the crowd gathered in scripture saying, "Hosanna! Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord." The blessed palm fronds that we hold signify our loyalty to Christ and when we hang them in our homes we are saying that Christ is the King of this house. All too shortly the tone of the Palm Sunday liturgy changes and the effects of sin overtake our hearts and in the gospel we cry out, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Here we hold in summary form the struggle we encounter as we seek to live in the world but not of the world.

The Sacred Triduum, the "Three Days" within Holy Week is to be experienced as one continuous journey of the Lord's death and resurrection rather than three isolated events. We begin the Triduum with the liturgy of Holy Thursday. Only one Mass is celebrated on this day, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, which symbolizes the unity that we find in Christ. The gospel for this day is John's account of the Lord's Supper which calls us to humble ourselves in loving service, in imitation of Jesus as he washed the feet of his disciples. There is no final blessing or dismissal for this Mass because our prayer continues with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament and the call to keep vigil with Jesus.

On Good Friday the church is stark and bare. There is no Mass on Good Friday. We begin our prayer in silence. The focus of Good Friday is not so much a meditation on the pain of Jesus or a time of mourning, it is rather a remembering of God's unconditional love for us as Jesus freely gives his life for the salvation of the world. On this day we always read from John's gospel which shows Jesus in charge of his life. "I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord." (Jn 10:17-18) We call this day "Good" because we are praising God for the gift of his Son Jesus and the life we share in him because of his death and resurrection. Our veneration of the cross is an expression of our love for God and the victory Christ has won for us through his Precious Blood. The cross an instrument of death becomes the very Tree of Life. We leave church in silence as we ponder throughout the next day anything that needs to be removed from our hearts as we prepare to renew our Baptismal promises at Easter.

The Easter Vigil takes us on a journey from death to life. The Vigil begins in darkness. Our hearts are taken back to the very dawn of creation and we light the Easter fire and pray, "May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our minds and hearts." The Exultet is sung proclaiming Christ's victory over sin and death. We then gather like our ancestors in faith who gathered around the fire to tell the stories of God's abiding presence and unconditional love. We take a quick journey through salvation history which leads us to the proclamation of the Gospel account of the resurrection. We break our fast as we sing with great joy "Alleluia, Christ is Risen!" Our focus then turns to the waters of Baptism; those preparing to be received into the Church are welcomed and all the Baptized renew their Baptismal promises to turn away from sin and to walk as Children of God. Having sealed this covenant with the sprinkling of the Easter water we gather around the altar to

share in the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus that nourishes us and draws us into communion with God and one another.

This week I encourage you to put aside the time needed to enter into the beauty and mystery of this solemn feast. The gift of the Sacred Triduum reminds us of God's dream for us and the covenant of love he shares with us through his Son, Jesus Christ. The beauty of the liturgy brings together the past, present and future as we celebrate the life we share in the Risen Lord. In this great mystery of love, our hearts are filled with joy!

Good Friday Fast and Abstinence

March 25th is a day of abstinence from meat and also a day of fast. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. (canons 97 and 1252).

Corporal Works of Mercy Series: Bury the Dead

In Israel, it was important that burial of the body take place with due honor. In this action we are saying, "You matter." We see this in the burial of Jesus. It is the confirmation of death but death does not end the story. Since Christ rose from the grave, the grave becomes a sign of hope that those who have died in Christ will rise again through Him. For Christians burial speaks of the twofold sacredness of the body, we are created and we are redeemed by God. Burial honors the body as a temple of God's Spirit. God's mercy extends to the living and the dead. Pray for the souls in purgatory. Visit a cemetery this week and recall stories of your loved ones that have shaped your life. Allow this visit to increase within you a longing for our heavenly homeland.
