PASTOR'S PEN...

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy—These opening words from the Salve Regina prayer have been offered for centuries, often at the close of the rosary. They speak to us of the relationship we share with Mary our Mother. In the beginning God created all things and through Mary he brought forth the Mother of the re-created world. She is known as the New Eve and the Mother of Mercy.



“The title ‘Mother of Mercy’ is thought to have been first given to the Blessed Virgin by St. Odo (d. 942), Abbot of Cluny. It is a fitting title of our Lady both because she brought forth for us Jesus Christ, the visible manifestation of the mercy of the invisible God, and because she is the spiritual mother of the faithful, full of grace and mercy.” (Rev. Johann G. Roten, SM) God’s mercy flows from God’s “prevenient” grace, a word from the Latin “prae-venire,” which means “to come before.” Just as a parent loves their child before the child has done anything, so too God loves us and shares His mercy with us before we ever do anything. The Blessed Virgin Mary is a powerful example of God’s prevenient mercy. Mary, conceived without original sin, did not plan or earn her Immaculate Conception. God the Father prepared the way for His incarnate Son to be born among us for the salvation of the world. Mary found favor with God because of God’s special grace within her.

As Robert Stackpole states: “The Father of Mercy took the initiative with sinful mankind, fashioning Mary’s soul from the moment of conception, preserving it from the effects of original sin, making her soul the very masterpiece of His mercy, and it was this unique and extraordinary foundation of grace in Mary’s soul that enabled her, years later, to respond to the angel Gabriel’s message with total, trustful surrender: “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” (Lk 1:38)

St. John Paul II in his encyclical *Veritatis Splendor* wrote: “Mary is Mother of Mercy because her Son, Jesus Christ, was sent by the Father as the revelation of God’s mercy (Jn 3:16-18). Christ came not to condemn, but to forgive, to show mercy (Mt 9:13). And the greatest mercy of all is found in his being in our midst and calling us to meet him and to confess, with Peter, that he is ‘the Son of the living God’ (Mt 16:16). “Not having known sin, she [Mary] is able to have compassion on every kind of weakness. She understands sinful man and loves him with a mother’s love.”

In the month of May we honor Mary and pray through her intercession that we will be instruments of God’s mercy in the world today. (Immaculate Conception Painting by Peter Paul Rubens, 1628, Madrid)

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Comfort the Afflicted

We could say that this spiritual work of mercy is what the incarnation is all about. God became one like us to comfort us in our affliction, to free us from sin and death. The example of the Blessed Mother stands as a powerful witness of staying with someone in their darkest hour, not being able to DO anything while offering her presence as her gift of love. St. Paul proclaims the mercy of God as he writes “Blessed be...the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.” (2 Cor. 1:4) When we have touched our wounds to the wounds of Jesus they are able to be used as an instrument of mercy in the lives of others. If you have experienced the loss of a loved one, financial distress, a broken relationship, a shattered dream...God may call upon you to be a source of comfort to another who is experiencing the same suffering. We may think of things we can DO to help, but what is most important is the gift of our presence, just showing up and being there.
