#### The Ordination of Fr. Sean Wilson

With praise and thanksgiving to Almighty God and in gratitude to the Blessed Virgin Mary the Archdiocese of Cincinnati announces the ordination of Fr. Sean Michael Wilson, son of Mark and Peggy Wilson, to the sacred Priesthood of Jesus Christ. The Wilson family has participated in the life of Emmanuel Parish for many years and we

joyfully celebrate with them the call that God has placed within Fr. Sean's heart and the generous response that he has made to the priesthood. Sean's First Mass of Thanksgiving will take place at Emmanuel Church on Sunday, May 22nd. A reception will follow the Mass in the basement of the church.

On this Feast of the Most Holy Trinity we are invited to reflect upon the mystery of the relationship of love that is found between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Referring to this mystery Jesus says, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now." It's not that the disciples or we are academically challenged—it's more a question of the mystery found in this relationship of love. The mystery of the Trinity is not a puzzle to be solved but a relationship of love to be experienced over a lifetime.

You might be familiar with the prayer of St. Richard of Chichester, a 13th Century English Saint who wrote: "Three things do I pray, O Lord, to see thee more clearly; to love thee more dearly; to follow thee more nearly day by day." In the First Person of the Trinity we pray to see God the Father more clearly by recognizing that all humanity is created in the image of God and called to live in the love of God. Secondly, we want to love God more dearly by following the example of Jesus, the Son who gave of Himself unconditionally for the life of the world. Thirdly, we want to follow God more nearly by allowing the Spirit of God to work in and through our lives.

God is revealed to us as a community of persons living in unity. He invites us to live in this communion of love. To help us grow in unity we are given families and various communities that become schools of charity so that we might learn how to love. In the life of a family we learn to practice patience and forgiveness, but we also learn that sometimes we can be selfish and immature. Jesus has shown us what it means to offer unconditional love as He reached out to all people acting like a bridge, calling us to live in the unity of the Holy Trinity. Each of us is called by God to celebrate the rich diversity that is found in the Body of Christ and to conform our lives to the mystery of the Lord's cross. By living in such a loving way we will experience the joy, peace and gratitude that come from within the mystery of the Holy Trinity.



# Spiritual Works of Mercy: Pray for the Living and the Dead

Everyone can easily participate in this spiritual work of mercy because it only demands a little bit of time. When we pray we place our lives in God's hands and open our hearts to hear God's will for us and our world. Prayer not only helps the one you are praying for, but also helps you to grow in your relationship with God. Our belief is that nothing, neither life nor death, can separate us from the love of Christ (Romans 8:35). Pray for the lost, the forgotten, those you love and those you look upon as an enemy. Pray for healing, hope and health. Pray for the impossible to become possible and for a true and lasting peace for yourself and others. We never know how God will use our prayer to bring life to the world. We pray not only for the living but also for the dead because of our belief in resurrection life. "[Judas Maccabeus] turned to prayer beseeching that the sin which had been committed might be wholly blotted out... He also took up a collection... and sent it to Jerusalem to provide for a sin offering. In doing this he acted very well and honorably... Therefore he made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin" (II Maccabees 12:39-46). We pray for the dead as they come before the judgment seat of God so they may be open to receive God's reconciling love and mercy.
