PASTOR'S PEN

Learning to see as Jesus sees is a lifelong journey of clearing our vision so that we can see with the eyes and heart of God. All too often our judgment of others blinds us to the truth. Simon the Pharisee in today's gospel sees Jesus and takes offence at him because of his interaction with sinners. The woman who anoints the feet of Jesus sees a prophet of God who offers mercy and forgiveness. What do you see when you look upon Jesus?

Jesus has come to save sinners. In John's gospel we read, "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (Jn 3:17) Anyone who comes to Jesus with a humble and contrite heart will be saved. In today's gospel Simon the Pharisee wants to keep sinners out, but Jesus wants to draw them near.

What motivated the woman to come to Jesus and seek his mercy and forgiveness? Maybe she had heard Jesus preaching or saw him reaching out with compassion to the lepers and tax-collectors and this stirred her heart to trust that she too could receive his merciful love. We can see that the woman came prepared to anoint the feet of Jesus, a task that was given to the lowest of servants. She probably expected to see that the feet of Jesus had been washed by one of Simon's servants, but they were still dirty; so she washes them with her tears and dries them with her hair before they are anointed.

Imagine the look of disapproval in Simon's eyes at the sight. Simon's main concern was to find out if Jesus was a prophet. A prophet would have known that this woman was a sinner he would not have had anything to do with her. For Simon, holiness meant separation...recall that the word Pharisee means "separate." A person achieves holiness by keeping oneself separate from sin and from sinners. Jesus should have shunned this woman but he didn't.

Jesus tries to help Simon the Pharisee to see the gift of God's merciful love through a parable about a creditor who is owed 500 denarii and 50 by the second. Neither debtor can repay the debt and asks to be pardoned. Jesus wants Simon to see that those who are forgiven the most—love the most. When Jesus came to his home Simon did not offer any of the basics of hospitality whereas the woman has been extravagant in her expression of love for Jesus. She recognized her great debt and rejoiced in God's mercy. The woman is not forgiven because she washes the feet of Jesus; she is forgiven because of her faith in Jesus, that he would heal her and not reject her. Jesus came to save sinners because they are also children of God.

John of the Cross says, "The soul is like a bird, and a bird is bound to the ground just as effectively by a light thread as by a heavy chain. In either case it cannot fly." What is holding you back from experiencing the mercy and forgiveness of God? Has a judgmental attitude gotten in the way of you being an instrument of God's mercy? If so, it is time to return to the Lord recognizing that Jesus has the power and authority to forgive us and lead us back to life.

The Sacred Heart and Divine Mercy

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified." "For evangelization today," St. John Paul II stated that, "the Heart of Christ must be recognized as the heart of the Church: It is He who calls us to conversion, to reconciliation. It is He who leads pure hearts and those hungering for justice along the way of the Beatitudes. It is He who achieves the warm communion of the members of the one Body. It is He who enables us to adhere to the Good News and to accept the promise of eternal life. It is He who sends us out on mission. The heart-to-heart with Jesus broadens the human heart on a global scale."

Prayer in Honor of the Sacred Heart

O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins I offer you this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, Good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you. Protect me in the midst of danger. Comfort me in my afflictions. Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen.

St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) from her Diary: Divine Mercy in My Soul. St. Faustina prayed, "I want to be completely transformed into Your mercy and to be Your living reflection, O Lord.

Help me, O Lord, that my eyes may be merciful, so that I may never suspect or judge from appearances, but look for what is beautiful in my neighbors' souls and come to their

Help me, that my ears may be merciful, so that I may give heed to my neighbors' needs and not be indifferent to their pains and moaning.

Help me, O Lord, that my tongue may be merciful, so that I should never speak negatively to my neighbor, but have a word of comfort and forgiveness for all.

Help me, O Lord, that my hands may be merciful and filled with good deeds, so that I may do only good to my neighbors and take upon myself the more difficult and toil-some tasks.

Help me, that my feet may be merciful, so that I may hurry to assist my neighbor, overcoming my own fatigue and weariness.

Help me, O Lord, that my heart may be merciful so that I myself may feel all the sufferings of my neighbor.

May your mercy, O Lord, rest upon me." (Diary, 163)
