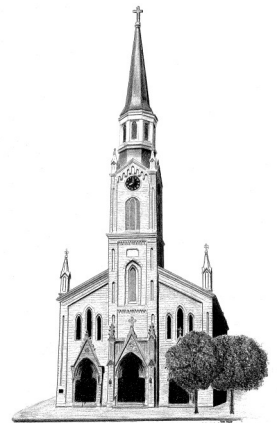

PASTOR'S PEN

Over 2,700 years ago the Prophet Isaiah shared a vision and a dream that God had for His people. In today's first reading he describes God as a loving mother caring for her child. Isaiah was proclaiming the message that even though they were experiencing a time of suffering and pain, God had not abandoned his people. The people of God were to look beyond their own brokenness and to see the gift of new life that was appearing all around them.

Over 2,000 years ago, as we heard in today's gospel, Jesus sent 72 disciples out into the world to share the message of God's abiding presence by healing the sick and sharing the peace of God. The disciples were not to carry any money or extra clothing with them on their missionary trip because God would provide for their needs; they had to learn how to trust in the Lord. Once the mission was finished the disciples came back rejoicing in all that God had done in and through their work.

240 years ago, a group of men gathered in Philadelphia with a dream, seeking freedom from oppression, they risked their lives to sign the Declaration of Independence. This document states that there are certain inalienable rights basic to what it means to be human...life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. The founders of our country had no assurance that things would turn out as planned, yet they took the risk and followed a dream that God had placed in their hearts.

Each of us is on a journey of faith leading us to our true and lasting homeland in heaven. Just as our ancestors of old, we will encounter challenges as we work to proclaim the message of the Kingdom of God. Like St. Paul we are to boast in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and allow his wounds to be the source of our strength. Christ can transform our suffering into new life! Like our ancestors of old may we stay close to God and one another as we place our lives in God's hands.

Remembering Religious Liberty on Independence Day

From June 21 – July 4, the U.S. Catholic bishops are recognizing a "Fortnight for Freedom" to draw special attention to the right of religious liberty. As we approach the celebration of the birth of our nation, people of faith are encouraged to remember that our nation's founders embraced freedom of religion as an essential condition of a free and democratic society. They enshrined this vision in the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights, which guarantees that "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." This has meant that churches and religious institutions are not only free to worship in their own way, but they are also free to exercise ministries of education, charity and social justice that reflect their fundamental beliefs and serve all people, regardless of faith, economic position, or immigration status. "Civilize It," is an Archdiocese of Cincinnati initiative to encourage civil discourse in political campaigns at all levels. This is one way that Catholics can be an "outpouring of mercy" during this electoral cycle. "We've all experienced it. A Facebook post, a family dinner, a water cooler conversation that suddenly turns political with opposing viewpoints. You might get angry. You may go silent. "Civilize It" is about making room in your heart and speaking peacefully with those with whom you disagree. Imagine what would happen if aggressiveness were transformed into openness and confrontations were turned into thoughtful conversation. "Civilize It" is a non-partisan movement and a call for all of us to help change the tone, follow our faith, and quiet the quarrels in our day-to-day lives.

The Civilize It Pledge:

- 1) Civility—To reflect respect, to throw no stones, and to rise above it.
- 2) Clarity—To align my political points of view with my formed conscience.
- 3) Compassion—To encounter others with a tone and posture that say "I see dignity and goodness in you."

The campaign website — www.civilizeit.us — invites people to consider taking a three-part pledge to respect civility, to reflect clarity in their point of view and to encounter others with compassion. Car magnets and yard signs to promote this project are available in the back of church.
