#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

Today's gospel reading offers us the opportunity to reflect upon the gift of mercy. That which was lost has been found. With the parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son Jesus is making a point that He doesn't want a single sinner to be lost and that He is willing to go to great lengths to seek us out and save us, to welcome us home.

Over and over again the tax collectors and sinners had been told by the Pharisees that they were unworthy to come before the Lord. Jesus wants the Pharisees to see that they too are lost in their relationship with God. We all need God's help. Who among us has not foolishly used the gifts God has given to us like the younger son in today's parable? Who among us has not lost sight of the basic dignity of each human person by casting judgment like the older son?

The parable of the forgiving father begins with the younger son asking for his inheritance. Basically he's saying, "Dad, I don't want to wait until you are dead to get what is coming to me." He's rejecting family, community and tradition. His vision is simply on today's pleasures. Sometimes we act like the younger son when we chase after things that we think will bring us happiness but in the end leave us empty and lost.

The elder son's reaction is no surprise to us. After all, he has been the dutiful son, doing everything his father asked. Unfortunately, he saw himself more as a slave than a son and in doing everything right he assumed that now he could be the judge.

The action of the father shows the merciful love he has for both of his children. The parable calls us to respect the dignity of all life, even when that life has messed-up and desires to return home. Sin does not destroy our identity as children of God.

The forgiving father's heart is not divided. He does not compare his two sons. He loves them both and expresses that love according to their individual journeys. As a good steward he treasures all of the gifts given to him. Jesus gives us the image of the forgiving father to ponder, reminding us that we must continually work at revealing the face of the Father's mercy to one another.

Just as in the parable of the lost coin where the woman looks everywhere until she has found the lost coin, the Father recognizes that someone is missing from his table. In the heart of God there is always a place called home for us to return to when we sin or fail in our call to be good stewards of creation. God has entrusted us with this created world. With renewed hearts let's joyfully accept our role as instruments of mercy in the world today, continuing the mission of Jesus Christ.

A reminder that a charitable tax break for IRA owners is permanent. Individuals who are 70 1/2 and older can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRAs directly to charity at any time during the year. The tax law that passed December 2015 made this tax break permanent. These transfers count as part of your yearly minimum distribution. There are several tax benefits of these direct IRA payouts to charity. The distributions aren't taxable and won't cause you to have extra income that could reduce your itemized deductions or personal exemptions, or trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits. Of course, you can't also deduct the donation. You may want to consider this for any future contributions, including unpaid pledges to One Faith, One Hope, One Love.
