PASTOR'S PEN

One way to pray with sacred scripture is to take on the identity of one of the characters in the reading; to enter their world, their thoughts and dreams. Today, let's take on the identity of the rich man in the gospel. What does he want to say to us?

Historically, some have called me "Dives" but that is not my name. Dives is simply the Latin word for rich man. I am not named in this gospel because all that gave me my identity in the world is gone. It is Lazarus who is now remembered by name, a name which means, "God is my help." You heard part of my story today but there is more that I want to say to you.

It is true I had a very nice house, the best food and clothing money could buy...I was somebody...and far too important in my own eyes to be bothered by a beggar. At first, the sight of Lazarus bothered me. I was uncomfortable seeing such poverty. "Why did he lie at my door and beg?" Then the excuses began to run through my mind, "I don't owe him anything. If I give him something he will just get booze. He's just lazy." After a while I just didn't see him anymore --he was there but I just ignored him. It was easier that way.

How often do we take notice of the people around us—their needs, their concerns? Not just the homeless people but also, the young mother struggling to make ends meet, the teenager being bullied, the neighbor who struggles with the news of a terminal illness, the elderly person who sits at home all alone day after day or the person looking for employment but finds no work. I just didn't notice; I didn't care.

You know, my problems didn't begin at death. They really started much earlier than that. The more possessions I had the more I guarded them and the more isolated I became. I worried about power and prestige and positions of honor at feasts. What I forgot was the lesson I learned as a child, God is the Lord of creation and the owner of all things. Nothing really belongs to any of us. God has made us to be stewards of creation so that we can care for creation and share what has been given to us for the sake of the common good.

At one time I agreed with people who said: "Hey, I earned what I have!" This may be so, but who gave you the mind, the talent, the health and the opportunity to do what you have accomplished? Yes, it is uncomfortable being confronted by the poor. Be grateful that you feel that way. It means you still have a conscience and a heart. Next time you are confronted with someone who is poor or in need of help ask yourself, "Why has God placed this person in my life today?" And then respond in whatever manner will further the Kingdom of God.

You have the words of the prophets; you even have the example of God's son, Jesus, who extended His arms to embrace the world. I held on to what was mine and in the end lost it all. It's no one's fault but my own. Please, do not follow my example.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

The first Jubilee Year was proclaimed in the year 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII. The 'Jubilee Year' or 'Holy Year' is a special time of grace in the life of the Church. Since that first Jubilee, there have been only 29 others, the most recent being proclaimed by Pope John Paul II for the year 2000. Pope Francis called for a Jubilee Year of Mercy to be held from December 8, 2015 until November 20, 2016 in order to draw the eyes of the Church and of the world, in a particularly focused way, to the splendor of the mercy of God. In this year the Pope has called us to greater conversion of heart, greater fidelity to the Sacrament of Confession, and greater efforts to be living signs of mercy in our world.

A special practice that is connected to a Jubilee Year is a pilgrimage to a Holy Door. Jesus said, "Truly, I am the gate, the door. Whoever enters through me will be saved." (John 10:9) Pilgrims pass through the Holy Door as a gesture of leaving the past behind and crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from darkness to light. By participating in the *Walk of Mercy* which is scheduled for **October 16th** we will have the opportunity to pass through the Holy Door designated by Archbishop Schnurr at St. Mary's Church and renew our commitment to Jesus who is the Way to Salvation.
