PASTOR'S PEN

Imagine this, a simple idea to plan a birthday party for Grandma grows into a wonderful family reunion with people coming in from all over the county. A spark in the heart of a few elderly Sisters of the Precious Blood seeking to do something about the violence in the city of Dayton which grows into an ecumenical coalition of people praying at the site of homicides in Dayton.

Consider the simple seed of love for a family member who has cancer that inspires them to organize a *Relay for Life* in which thousands of people walk for the cure or how one person's idea to protect the unborn and their mom's from violence leads hundreds to gather in support of life by creating a person-to-person life-chain around abortion clinics all over the country.

Today we can see the effect of how a tiny inspiration to feed the poor grows into a worldwide organization, following the example of St. Vincent de Paul, whose branches cover every part of the world. With faith, the tiniest of seeds, the tiniest of ideas and inspirations can grow into the largest of plants, building a civilization of love. With faith you can do amazing things.

When we talk about the gift of faith we're not talking so much about doctrine or dogma, we're talking more about a relationship in which a person responds to God's invitation to share in His love. The gift of faith is a commitment to live a particular way of life, to give your life in service to the Lord. As such we can say that faith is more a verb than a noun and that faith increases through our obedience to live what God commands. How do we measure our faith? The best way is to simply measure our faithfulness.

In this Year of Mercy Pope Francis has invited us to be the face of mercy in the world. One way to live the call of mercy is to recognize the dignity of all human life. Each year in the month of October the bishops of the United States call us to observe *Respect Life Month*, a time to particularly reflect on life issues and to pray for and promote greater respect for all human life. This year's theme is "Moved by Mercy." Pope Francis once said, "All of us must care for life, cherish life, with tenderness, warmth...to give life is to open our heart, and to care for life is to give oneself in tenderness and warmth for others, to have concern in my heart for others. Caring for life from the beginning to the end; what a simple thing, what a beautiful thing. So, go forth and don't be discouraged. Care for life. It's worth it."

What is a Holy Door of Mercy and why go on Pilgrimage?

The use of Holy Door's goes back to at least the year 1475 as a ritual expression of conversion. The Holy Door is a unique door in each of the Major Papal Basilicas in Rome which is ordinarily sealed with brick, but which is opened for Jubilee Years when pilgrims cross through it as a symbolic gesture. Pilgrims and penitents pass through the door as a gesture of leaving the past behind and crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from slavery to freedom, and from darkness to light. A Holy Door finds meaning only when the believer associates the door with Christ, Jesus is the Door!

Another ancient practice of the church is the act of going on a pilgrimage which helps to remind us that in this life we are all pilgrims on a journey leading to eternal life. When someone

goes on a religious pilgrimage they do not go as a tourist to be entertained, but rather they journey as a seeker, actively engaging all their senses to experience the Living God. The pilgrim leaves the regular concerns of life aside in order to focus their attention on encountering the presence of God.

Not everyone can travel to Rome to pass through the Holy Door and so each diocese is invited to designate certain church doors as Holy Doors for this Jubilee Year of Mercy. You are invited to set aside a couple of hours on October 16th beginning at 2:00 p.m. and join us for our Jubilee Walk of Mercy from Holy Trinity Church to St. Mary's Church to pass through the Holy Door of Mercy.
