PASTOR'S PEN

The word "persistence" stands out clearly for us in today's scripture readings. We're given the image of the hands of Moses being raised up with the staff of God in hand, a sign of persistence as the Israelites battled their enemy. In the Letter to Timothy, we hear the call to "proclaim the Word of God; to be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient. Then in the Gospel reading we see the persistence of the widow coming before the unjust judge.

Often when we look at this parable we think of God as the judge who finally wears down and gives the widow what she wants. And yet, we know from the Book of Sirach (35) that God is not deaf to the cry of the widow, and that God judges justly and affirms the right without delay." So, the parable is not saying: "If I just badger God enough he'll change his mind and give me what I want." This response contradicts scripture and tradition which tell us that God is eager and willing to give to those who ask, seek and knock; especially the poor and vulnerable.

In taking a closer look at the parable we see that neither character fits the role we expect to see. A judge is supposed to fear God and to act with justice. Yet, in this parable the judge is clearly dishonest, fearing neither God nor human beings. In the parable, the judge remains unmoved by the widow's persistent pleas. As judge he is supposed to be representing God, but he is acting totally contrary to what God would do.

Then we have a widow who we expect to be vulnerable and defenseless because at the time of Jesus the widow was at the mercy of the nearest male relative who was to care for them. But, in this parable the widow boldly faces the unjust judge, voicing her demands until she achieves justice on her own behalf.

In the English translation of this passage we miss the full image of parable. In English the judge says "I will settle in her favor or she will end by doing me violence." Scripture scholars tell us that in Greek the verb actually refers to a boxing term that literally means "to strike under the eye." So we see Jesus painting a very different picture in this parable when he tells us that the powerful judge is fearful that the defenseless widow could give him a black eye!

When we look to the character of the widow as the God figure, we gain a new insight into this parable. When a person persistently resists injustice, faces it, names it, denounces it until right is achieved, then this person is acting as God does. God never gives up on us. As Jesus embraced the cross, He seemed helpless in the face of the executioners, yet he won for us the price of our salvation by defeating the powers of sin and death without using violence, with persistence and hope.



The Walk of Mercy is this Sunday. We will gather at Holy Trinity Church at 2:00 and walk to St. Mary's Church. If you are not able to walk that distance you can join us at St. Mary's Church at 3:00 and participate in the prayer service at the Holy Door of Mercy.

St. Gaspar del Bufalo founded the Missionaries of the Precious Blood on August 15, 1815 at the Abbey of San Felice in Giano, a village nestled in the Umbrian Hills of Italy. Gaspar's small congregation began after the defeat of Napoleon to bring reconciliation and renewal to the church and world. Their primary ministry was preaching

the Word of God, especially in parish missions held in isolated villages in the rural hills.

Gaspar was a powerful preacher who inspired all who heard him to turn to the Precious Blood of Jesus for solace and guidance in life. After helping cholera victims in Rome in late 1837, Gaspar died in the city he loved on December 28, 1837. The medical report called him a "victim of charity." Gaspar was beatified in 1904 and canonized a saint on June 12, 1954. October 21st is the Feast of St. Gaspar del Buffalo.
