PASTOR'S PEN

One of the regular sounds I hear around the neighborhood is the sound of sirens announcing to all who can hear that some type of emergency vehicle is on the way to a fire, to the hospital or on the move to help someone in need. When we hear a siren, we are to slow down, look around and be prepared to stop.

John the Baptist was one such siren announcing the coming of the Messiah. He announced, "Reform your lives, the reign of God is at hand." Slow down, stop and look around otherwise you might miss the mystery of God's love being revealed. John is not asking us to add another thing to our already busy schedules and preparations. He is challenging us to allow Christ to be a part of our day to day experiences, to let His light be our guide.

In the Day of the Lord, "the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid goat with a child to guide them." "The cow and the bear shall be neighbors and the baby shall play by the cobra's den" (Isaiah 11). In this vision enemies become friends. Creation is restored to the original harmony that God intended when he created the world. This harmony was lost with the sin of Adam and Eve and ever since that time God has been working to bring reconciliation and peace to our world. As St. Paul said in his Letter to the Romans, "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you the ability to think in harmony with one another..."

This vision of unity is a part of the miracle of Christmas. During this time of the year there is a feeling of harmony, joy and peace, a willingness to see one another as brothers and sisters. We work extra hard to be more patient, more understanding, more accepting of one another. Our mission is to work to restore the harmony that was lost in the Garden of Eden; not only to speak about the vision, but to live the vision each day.

That is why the message of John the Baptist is so important for us in this Advent journey. John is calling us to repent! The Scripture scholar, Sr. Diane Bergant, reminds us that the "word repent comes from the Greek root for metanoia, a change of mind and heart, a change that is much more easily described than accomplished." All too often we are like St. Augustine who once said: "Change me, Lord...but not yet." If we are to experience peace we must be willing to change our hearts.

This call to repent and change our mind and heart is not only to be experienced in our family, but it must also be for those we consider our enemies. To live out Isaiah's vision we must be willing to humble ourselves and be willing to walk the path of forgiveness. We must be willing to remove the darkness of prejudice, jealousy or pride and live in the light of truth which respects the dignity of each person as a child of God. Today we must ask ourselves,

"What needs to change in my heart and mind so that I can live Isaiah's vision of harmony and lasting peace?"
