PASTOR'S PEN

Every day we are faced with choices, from the color of clothes we wear, to the way we treat one another, from the shows we watch on TV to the internet sites we visit, from the way we do our job or the way we spend our free time. You and I are constantly making choices and as Christians we are always called to choose life, to use our time and talent wisely, to see our world as God sees it, to follow the example of Jesus in the way we treat others.

Today, the cynicism that marks many conversations, the general dissatisfaction with life and other people has become a past time sport. We hear comments like, "Oh, what a jerk he is!" or "She doesn't have a brain in her head." Jesus offers us a thought provoking challenge today, to go beyond the letter of the law to see where our intentions and motivations lie in life. "You have heard it said, "Do not kill," I say, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." Morally speaking we know that anger is an emotion and as such is neither good nor evil; the question Jesus raises is "What do you do with the anger that burns in your heart?" So often we simply react to life's challenges rather than seek out a response that is appropriate and justified. Jesus raises this concern because he realizes the destructive power that hate, anger and resentment can have in a person's heart.

This liturgical year we are reading from Matthew's gospel. Matthew was writing to Christians who had first been Jews and to those Jews who were considering the possibility of becoming Christians. They knew Hebrew Scripture very well. Fr. Joseph Pellegrino notes that, "In the gospel of Matthew there are five main talks or teachings of the Lord that are modeled on the five books of the Law or the Torah. The first is the one we are reading from today, the Sermon on the Mount. Just as Moses went up Mount Sinai to bring the Ten Commandments, God's law for His people, in Matthew's gospel, Jesus climbs the mountain of the Beatitudes to present the fulfillment of the Law of Moses."

Jesus says, "It's not enough to simply obey the law, we must live the spirit of the law." For example, we may never pull the trigger and kill someone and yet with a hateful attitude we do a good job of killing someone's reputation, ruining their selfesteem or destroying their identity as a child of God. In this frame of mind, we are certainly not choosing life.

Someone once asked Mother Teresa, "What will we be judged on?" She responded, "I believe that when we die and the time comes for us to be judged, God will not ask how many good things we did in our lives, but only with how much love we did them." It's like St. Paul said: "You can have fancy speech but if you don't have love, you have nothing. You can give away all you have but if you don't have love, you gain nothing."

God has given us the gift of free will, to choose to follow Him or to choose to follow our own path. A wise person has made the choice to see as God sees, to listen as God listens, and to love as God loves. In our life-time we make many choices. Some of them are very significant and others seem inconsequential. No matter what choice we are making may we always make a choice for life, to love as God loves us.
