PASTOR'S PEN

The last several weeks we have been listening to Jesus and his sermon on the mount. In this sermon, Jesus is helping us to live life to the fullest. As Jesus looked out over the crowd he saw people of every kind, He knew their challenges and could see in their faces how easy it was to get tied up in worry and fear.

In today's Gospel, Jesus directs our attention to the lessons of creation. Just as God cares for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field God cares for us! Jesus reminds the people that they must keep their eyes on God.

In the book "Desert Wisdom" there is the story of a monk named Doulas walking with Abbot Bessarion. Doulas said, "Father, I am very thirsty." Then the old man prayed and said to me, "Drink from the sea." To my surprise the water was sweet when I drank it, not salty. Then I poured as much as I could into a flask, so that I would not be thirsty later. Seeing this, the old man asked me, "Why are you doing that?" I answered, "Excuse me, but it's so that I won't be thirsty later." Then the old man said, "God is here, and God is everywhere."

- Worry enters our lives when we try to live too far into the future trying to figure out how something is going to work out.
- Worry happens when we try to control various part of our life wanting everything to work out the way we think it should be.
- Worry also enters when we try to serve two masters: God or wealth, God or power, God or material goods, God or another person.

During the time of the Prophet Isaiah, the Israelites felt that God had abandoned them in their exile and some even felt that God had caused the exile. Through Isaiah God says, "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the children of her womb? Even should she forget, I will never forget you."

Often, when we get caught up in worry we miss the gift that each day brings: the beauty of creation, the peacefulness of music, the playful heart of a child, the gift of life itself. The ultimate reminder we have been given that God never abandons us is found in the Body and Blood of Jesus that we receive in the Eucharist.

Whatever worry you have in your life, bring it to the foot of the cross and live in the hope and the promise that just as God transformed the suffering and death of Jesus into the glory of His resurrection, God will provide for us in our need. God is here...God is everywhere. God says to us today, "I will never forget you!"

Lenten Regulations for Fast and Abstinence:

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the penitential season of Lent. In addition to the general penitential character of the Lenten Season:

- ♦ Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat 1 full meal as well as 2 smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there is frequent question about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially", the penitential days specified by the church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious; rather it is the failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days which must be considered serious.
- ♦ The Law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The Law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).


