PASTOR'S PEN

Have you ever been to the top of a high mountain? There is something about being on a mountain that lifts your mind & heart to heaven. Even if we may have never been to the top of a mountain, we have all had mountaintop experiences, those highpoints in life where we have experienced success, or serenity, or satisfaction; those times when we have stood in awe at the miracle of God's love for us through the people and experiences we encounter in life.

Our first transformative experience came through the waters of baptism when we received a new identity as a child of God and the common vocational call to holiness. In St. Paul's letter to Timothy we heard that "God has saved us and called us to a holy life, not according to our works, but according to his own design." (2 Tim 1:9) In destroying sin and death Christ has given us the bright promise of everlasting life. God was calling Timothy and is calling each of us to follow Him by living a life of holiness and truth.

The most amazing of all mountaintop experiences would have to be the transfiguration of Jesus, his face shown like the sun and his clothes became white as light. In that mountaintop experience Jesus gave his disciples an amazing vision of what will be in the reign of God. This mountaintop experience became an important part of the memory of the disciples and the church. They would not be staying on the mountain and life would present many temptations, doubts and pain. This memory of the transfiguration would be a source of hope, a symbol of God's promise to be fulfilled.

One of the goals of the Lenten season is our personal transfiguration. We recognize that we are not always living the faith that we profess and God invites us to turn away from our old ways of life and to embrace the identity we were given in baptism as children of God.

One powerful way of experiencing this transfiguration is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation also called Confession or Penance. When confronted with the reality of our sin, God, who is rich in mercy, offers us a way to cleanse our heart and mind and soul removing the burden of sin and restoring us to the original dignity of our baptism. Talk about a transformation!

Someone once asked: "What is the difference between a sinner and a saint? The answer — confession. On **Tuesday, March 14th** every parish or pastoral region in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will open its doors from **7:00 to 9:00 p.m.** for prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Penance or Confession. "Those who approach the sacrament of Penance obtain pardon from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, and are, at the same time, reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by their sins and which by charity, by example, and by prayer labors for their conversion." Lenten Pilgrimage

Starting Point: Our Lady of the Precious Blood, Guatemala City, Guatemala

While Guatemala's rich soil supports lush plant life, its people often find it harder to thrive. More than half of the population lives below the nation's poverty line, and a third of the nation cannot read or write. It has often been plagued by violence, particularly during a decades-long civil war, the scars of which still linger. Precious Blood missionaries carry out parish ministry through Nuestra Señora de la Preciosa Sangre (Our Lady of the Precious Blood) in the capital city. 1995, Sangre de Cristo Health Care Project was instituted as a non-profit. The Project Mission includes creation of an integrated health care system and sharing the fruits of love, peace, faith and hope that come from God. In 2000, the project conducted its first Surgery Campaign, with the help of volunteers from Dayton, Ohio.
