PASTOR'S PEN

Alleluia! The Lord is Risen! As we celebrate this wonderful Easter season we recognize that the gift of the resurrection is more than simply an event that happened to Jesus many years ago or something that we hope to experience in the future when our bodies will be raised to new life. The gift of the resurrection is a gift that has the power to impact every moment of our life. Since Christ is risen from the dead we hold a different script in our hands. What was thought to be the end has been made new. This is true for broken relationships, lost opportunities, fearful encounters of the unknown and any challenge that comes our way as the result of sin or death. Jesus says to us today, "See, I make all things new!"

Easter reminds us that it is never too late to start over. With God's help, we roll back the stone that entombs us, that keeps us from becoming the person God meant us to be. To stay in the tomb of our unbelief is to deny our belief that God has the last word and that word is life! Yes, some people get stuck in the silence of God interpreting it to mean that God does not care about their suffering. It is important to remember that God has not come to rescue us from pain and suffering and death; God has come to redeem us, to transform our lives. This calls us to a deeper awareness of the importance of faith, hope and trust in God, to remain faithful especially when nothing makes sense.

The Scribes and Pharisees thought that they had succeeded in silencing Jesus, the Word Made Flesh. But when the appointed time had come, God's voice came through loud and clear, "Peace be with you." "Do not be afraid." Easter teaches us that we must learn patience in our weakness, to listen for the voice of the Risen Lord in ways we least expect.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus instructs Mary Magdalene to go to the disciples and tell them, "He has been raised from the dead, and he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him." Why go to Galilee? Fr. Ronald Rolheiser notes that for the disciples, Galilee was a place involving the heart. "Galilee is the dream, the road of discipleship that they had once walked with Jesus, and that place and time when their hearts had most burned with hope and enthusiasm."

This image of returning to a familiar place is like an account in John's gospel when Jesus goes back to the Jordan River, to the place where he was baptized. Here Jesus heard the voice of his Father say, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased, listen to him." Before his passion, Jesus returned to this familiar place, a place of identity so that he could hear once again the Father's dream for him.

In returning to Galilee the disciples went back to where it all began to renew their hopes and dreams as disciples of Jesus. Their call had not changed; it's just that they would be led in a different way. The same is true for us. On this Easter Sunday, as we renew our baptismal promises and are sprinkled with the Easter water which reminds us of our baptism, our hopes and dreams are renewed. Jesus appears to us, giving us his Body and Blood to strengthen us, to reassure us that he is risen and is with us. Alleluia! Let us rejoice today that he is truly risen.

Divine Mercy Devotions at Emmanuel on April 23, 2017

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. Emmanuel Church will be hosting an afternoon of prayer in honor of this Feast which was instituted for the Second Sunday of Easter by Saint John Paul II in the year 2000. The message of Divine Mercy was given to Saint Faustina of Poland. The message of Divine Mercy is rooted in the Gospel reading for this Sunday. In John's Gospel, Chapter 20, Jesus appears to the disciples and says to them "Peace be with you." "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." When speaking about the days within the Octave of Easter St. Augustine referred to them as "the days of mercy and pardon," and the Octave Day itself as "the compendium of the days of mercy." During the Octave of Easter we are invited to call upon the Divine Mercy of Jesus to guide us as we pray for the dying, for forgiveness and mercy, for conversion, for healing or for renewed hope.

Missionaries in Sondorillo, a village high in the mountains north of Lima, sometimes travel by dirt bike to the 24 small chapels spread out in the countryside. In 2014, only two Missionaries lived full time in Sondorillo, including Fr. James "Santiago" Gaynor, C.P.P.S., an Ohio native who ministered in Peru for 30 years. Scarcity of priests makes it critical that Missionaries train lay leaders. "The people are wonderful, and they love the fact that our priests are living among them," said Fr. Andoni Ledesma, C.P.P.S.
