

PASTOR'S PEN

An advisor once urged President Abraham Lincoln to give a position in his cabinet to a friend. But Lincoln refused. "Why?" asked the advisor. "Because I don't like the man's face," was the reply. "But the poor man isn't responsible for his face," said his friend. The president said, "Every man over forty is responsible for his face."

Because of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus we know that sin and death do not have the last words. A different script has been written and now all things are possible with God. Do our faces reveal this truth? Do we believe that our hope is rooted in God's covenant of love sealed in the Blood of Jesus?

Hope does not disappoint because God is our hope. It is the nature of God to fulfill the promises God has made through His covenant of love. In a sense, the gift of hope becomes the driving force we need to change the world, for it points the way to the coming Reign of God.

This is why Fr. Steve Bevens believes that the primary call to mission is found not in Matthew 28 (Go therefore and make disciples of all nations...) but rather, in 1 Peter 3 which says, "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asked you for a reason for your hope".

The virtue of Hope teaches us that God is working all things to the good. Hope is not dependent on other people's actions or choices. It is a gift from God that enables us to be at peace even in the challenges of life because we believe that God is ultimately in control.

The Catholicism of the Catholic Church speaks of hope in this way, "Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of Heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit." (#1817) "Hope keeps man from discouragement...sustains him during time of abandonment...opens up his heart in expectation of eternal beatitude." (#1818)

As Christians, we cannot keep the life we share in Christ all to ourselves. Our thoughts, words and actions must reflect and express the life of Jesus. His life has become our life, our hope of glory. Jesus knew that he would be leaving his disciples and so He promised to give us the Holy Spirit, "the paraclete" or "advocate, who will always defend us in truth.

Cultivating hope is one way to keep our hearts open to the action of God in our lives. Here are a few ways of cultivating the virtue of hope.

- ◆ Nurture a healthy awareness of yourself as a child of God.
- ◆ Practice simplicity. Find God in the most common of activities and experiences.
- ◆ Surround yourself with beauty which puts you in touch with the ultimate beauty found in Jesus Christ.
- ◆ See the cross as a gift to be embraced and appreciated
- ◆ trusting in God alone.
- ◆ Spend time in relationship that form community. Your heart expands in love as you reach out to others.

Some would say that our primary vocation as Christians is to be people of hope in the world. Do you live as a person of hope?

Precious Blood Missionaries in these rural parishes spend many hours driving through the mountains from one small chapel to another. In places where there are no chapels, they preside at Mass in homes or public halls. Fr. Jorge Gómez, C.P.P.S., associate pastor in Purranque, knows that he is in the right place. "God gave me this calling... It's gratifying for me to be present to sick people, old people, the people who need me."

Reflection: *Sadly, Human life, the person is no longer perceived as a primary value to be respected and protected, especially if poor or disabled, if not yet useful - such as the unborn child - or no longer needed - such as the elderly. (6/5/13. Environment)*

Brigid's Path organizers were overwhelmed by the generosity of Holy Trinity parishioners for all the donations during our Lenten almsgiving project.


