PASTOR'S PEN

In today's gospel celebrating the Ascension of the Lord, Jesus entrusts His mission to us as He commissions us to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations...teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Our hope is strengthened by the promise that Jesus made "to be with us always, until the end of the world." He will never abandon us. He will not leave us orphaned.



Since God is always at work in our lives drawing us into a deeper relationship of love it is important for us to be attentive to the work of the Holy Spirit active in our lives. This means that we wait with open eyes, ears, minds and hearts for the presence of Jesus among us in and through the life of the Holy Spirit.

Repeatedly in the Gospels, Jesus proclaimed the message that "the Kingdom of God is in your midst." Jesus is teaching us that heaven and earth interact in a fluid and relational way rather than as two separate worlds. First, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us revealing the Father's love for us." Then, after his death, when all seemed lost, the Risen Lord came to the disciples, revealing to them His bodily resurrection as He spoke to them, ate food with them, and then invited Thomas to touch Him.

Now, with the celebration of the Ascension, Jesus returns to the Father. Something of earth is taken up into heaven. Next week with the celebration of Pentecost we see something of heaven coming down to earth with the descent of the Holy Spirit. The close of the Easter season emphasizes the truth that heaven and earth belong to God and that God accompanies us as we await His return in glory.

How does Jesus continue the mission He began on earth? He accomplishes His work through His new body, the church, the community of believers. When we live the corporal works of mercy: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick and those in prison and burying the dead in the hope of resurrection life, we continue the saving mission of Jesus.

Sometimes in our conversations we speak of the mission of the Church, but in reality, the Church doesn't have a mission. Rather, the mission of Jesus has a Church. The Church and all believers must continually ask, am I participating in the mission of Jesus or am I just furthering my own mission. Jesus knew the temptation to further our personal kingdoms and so he included an important reminder in the Our Father prayer: "Thy Kingdom come"—not my kingdom; "Thy will be done"—not my will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

On this Feast of the Ascension we celebrate earth and heaven coming together in a communion of life and love as Jesus ascends into heaven. Next week we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost where heaven comes to earth through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. And so, let us pray: "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth."
