PASTOR'S PEN

This weekend the parishes in Region 7 will be celebrating the Feast of the Precious Blood of Christ with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. July 1st is the traditional Feast Day for the Precious Blood Congregation and we are given permission to celebrate this Solemnity in the various ministerial sites where our members are assigned. The scripture readings and prayers for Mass will come from those assigned to the Feast of the Precious Blood.

The First time I traveled to California I had the opportunity to visit Yosemite National Park to see the giant sequoia trees. Listening to the presentation by the park ranger I learned that unlike most trees which have root systems that grow deep into the ground, the roots of the sequoia only go 10-15 feet below the surface. How can such a shallow root system hold up a tree that can grow up to 300 feet tall? The answer is found in standing together. Sequoias only grow in groves and their roots grow together and intertwine with one another giving them extraordinary strength. So, when the strong winds come, they hold each other up.

As we celebrate the feast of the Precious Blood I got to thinking about how our lives are held together through the life-giving blood of Jesus. The Precious Blood of Jesus expresses the covenant of love that is share between God and God's people, a covenant that is unconditional and eternal. You might say it is our way of standing together, of holding each other up.

In the Gospel, we heard of a new covenant being initiate by Jesus. This new covenant was not seen as simply a "renewal" or "extension" of the covenants of old; it was to be understood as something foundational to the new age that was opening up to the people of God.

In the Eucharistic meal we share, the symbolism of the chalice is beautifully united with the symbolism of the blood. When the cup or chalice is spoken of in scripture it is seen as a vessel used for gathering and collecting. In today's reading, Luke speaks of two of the three cups that were traditionally offered in the Passover meal... the first cup, a cup of suffering, and the third cup, a cup of blessing.

To have a share in the cup of suffering is to join in the struggle against Satan and the forces of evil and injustice that are at work in society. Just as Jesus said yes to the cup of his passion and death, our yes to the cup means that we are willing to take on the sufferings of Christ's living body within our families, our parish, our city and country.

The next cup that Luke spoke of in today's Gospel was the third cup in the Passover meal, the cup of blessing. The cup of blessing is presented in celebration of and in thanksgiving for the new covenant. With this cup of blessing we celebrate the presence of the reign of God already at work among us.

At each Mass, the Eucharistic cup, the chalice, gathers together each of our lives, the suffering that cannot be avoided as well as the blessings of joy and hope that is found in Christ who is victorious over sin and death. Christ offers Himself to us--transforming us so that we can be "living chalices" for others, ready to pour out our lives as the living sacrament of Christ's blood binding us together as one.

As we continue to observe this year's Fortnight for Freedom we hear the call to stand together, to lean on one another for strength and courage. Through the Blood of Christ our lives are intertwined so that even amid the storms of life we can remain faithful and strong as God's holy people.
