PASTOR'S PEN

Today's gospel reading (Matthew 11:28-30) is one of the most comforting passages of scripture to be found in the Bible. The invitation to take up the yoke of Jesus so that he can help us carry our burdens offers us the gift of peace and hope.

All too often in the journey of life we act like the Greek mythological figure Atlas. In the old myth Atlas offended the king of the Greek gods, Zeus. For punishment Zeus made Atlas carry the weight of the world literally in his shoulders for all eternity. There are times in everyone's life when we take on the role of Atlas and carry the burdens of life alone, as if we were responsible to fix our world and all its problems.

Jesus provides a very different picture for us, one that would have been very familiar to the people of his day. In the time of Jesus most fields were plowed by oxen which were harnessed together with a yoke that was built for two. The yoke helps to distribute the weight and enables the oxen to work as a team. When Jesus invites us to take His yoke upon our shoulders he is not replacing one burden with another burden. He is inviting us to allow him to walk with us, to help us carry our burden. This doesn't mean that the burden is taken away, any more than we can remove the cross from our lives.

In today's reading, Jesus wants us to know that the yoke or the burden we carry is as much His as it is ours and through His covenant of love sealed in His Precious Blood, He has promised to be with us always, never to abandon us. When we allow Jesus to help us carry our burdens, he who is meek and humble of heart will teach us the way.

- We know we are walking with Jesus when we persevere through a difficult situation and can still be at peace.
- We know we are walking with Jesus when we treat each person with dignity and respect even when we are rejected.
- We know we are walking with Jesus when we are open to perspectives other than our own and take to heart the wisdom that is being shared.
- We know that we are walking with Jesus when we allow hope to be the anchor of our lives recognizing that God will give me what I need to make it through the day.

This is what St. Paul was reminding us of in our second reading. "We have life because of the Spirit of God who dwells within us." We are given the promise of new life by the same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead. Certainly St. Paul recognized the fact that all people will die, but sin and death do not have the last word. With the eyes of faith we see that we will live forever.

This vision is not easily seen by people of power or wealth or prestige because they see themselves as self-sufficient. The kind of Messiah Jesus came to show us was much different from the one the Jewish people longed to see. Just before his passion and death all four gospels show Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a work animal, an ass, not a majestic stallion or huge chariot. And as King, Jesus broke the cycle of violence not with weapons of destruction, but by making peace through the Blood of His cross.

Jesus understands the burdens we carry in life... He knows rejection & betrayal, He has been misunderstood and tempted, He has felt the pain of suffering and death.

Whatever burden you bring with you today, see Jesus walking along side of you, sharing in the weight of your burden. Look to Him and He will show you the best way to carry your cross and help you find rest and peace.
