PASTOR'S PEN

Last week we heard the parable of the farmer who went out sowing seeds. Some seed fell on the path and the birds ate it. Some seed landed on rocks, sprouted and soon withered. Some landed among thorns which choked the seedlings. And some landed on fertile soil and produced an abundant harvest. Like the sowing of seeds there can be many obstacles to proclaiming the Word of God.

Today's Gospel puts us back into the field. This time we find out that even though the farmer planted good wheat seed, an enemy came and planted weeds that look like wheat. Now that their roots have grown together the owner of the farm decides that it is best to wait and separate the wheat from the weeds at harvest time.

Our world is like this field. We experience both good and bad in life. Though we might want to escape this reality and live in a safe isolated bubble it is not possible to escape the reality of sin and evil. Our world is not perfect and this side of heaven we will continually encounter the presence of both good and evil. We know this from the life of Jesus. You can be very, very good; you can be the Son of God and still get nailed to a cross.

Our call is to live in the world, but not to be of the world. Our responsibility in life is to follow the example of Jesus; to be a light and a leaven in the world that reflects the mercy, justice and compassion of God. Jesus didn't isolate himself from the brokenness and sinfulness of people; rather, he touched the lives of the Scribes and Pharisees as well as the tax collectors, prostitutes and unclean lepers. He didn't try to get rid of them or ignore them--he treated them as his brothers and sisters, all children of the same Father.

When we take a good honest look at our lives we can see that each of us is a blending of a saint and a sinner. God sees the potential for goodness within all his creation; even though we betray him and deny Him, God will never give up on us.

How do you recognize the weeds in your life? Chances are it is anything that does not require any effort or commitment or inconvenience on your part. Weeds require no labor. They just appear in the garden. Maybe the weed in your life is a lack of patience, a judgmental attitude, an addiction or bad habit, the need to feel superior or an attitude which says, "If it feels good, do it." Staying close to Jesus and all he has taught you will help to strengthen the growth of the Kingdom of God within you so the weeds will not overtake your heart.

Like the tiny mustard seed, the seed of the Kingdom of God given to us in baptism has the potential to grow and spread in amazing ways. As a common, ordinary garden herb, the mustard plant has the potential of taking over a whole garden. Once this

seed is planted, there is no stopping it! Jesus is saying to us...you are like this seed that holds such great potential. Don't keep your faith just to yourself...share it! Our responsibility is to be "wheat", mingling our lives with the life of Jesus so that others can see that the Kingdom of God is alive and at work in our world today!

A reminder that a charitable tax break for IRA owners is

permanent. Individuals who are 70 1/2 and older can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRAs directly to charity at any time during the year. The tax law that passed December 2015 made this tax break permanent. These transfers count as part of your yearly minimum distribution. There are several tax benefits of these direct IRA payouts to charity. The distributions aren't taxable and won't cause you to have extra income that could reduce your itemized deductions or personal exemptions, or trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits. Of course, you can't also deduct the donation. You may want to consider this for any future contributions, including unpaid pledges to One Faith, One Hope, One Love. Contact your tax advisor for more details.
