PASTOR'S PEN

One day a little girl asked her mother what people mean when they say, "all things work for the good for those who love God." Her mother was baking a cake and without directly answer the question, she handed her daughter a spoonful of baking soda. "Yuck! That tastes awful. Why did you give me that stuff to eat?" Her mother responded, "Amelia, I don't want you to ever forget this, you can't just focus on one thing in life. Like that baking soda, by itself it tastes bad, but when you mix it with flour, sugar, butter and milk and heat it in the oven something good is made. That is what it means to say, 'all things work for the good for those who love God.' If we only focus on the bad stuff in life then all we see is bad. But when look at all the parts of life, and put them together, mixing the crosses with the blessings in life, we begin to see the hand of God is leading all things to the good."

The bible reveals many stories of God's fidelity and the importance of trusting in God to lead all things to the good. When God promised to give Solomon anything he asked for, Solomon's response could have been for personal wealth, fame, a life free from pain. But he didn't. Solomon asked for "an understanding heart that he might discern right from wrong." Solomon's request revealed his concern for God's people and the wisdom needed to place his trust in God and God's goodness.

The gift of wisdom enables us to identify the greatest treasure in life as the Kingdom of Heaven that Jesus announced to His disciples. In recognizing this treasure, we see that God is the source of all life, the one



who teaches us what it means to love unconditionally. By embracing the cross Jesus taught us that everyone's life is going to experience both suffering and joy. God can bring forth new life even from terrible suffering. The cross of Christ becomes our true treasure and everything else pales in comparison to it.

Because of Christ's victory over sin and death, the cross takes on new meaning for us. Sometimes when the hard knocks of life come our way we find it hard to live in the hope that God is bringing all things to the good. Rather than continuing our search for the true and lasting treasure we stop looking and fall into despair. When we look at our life with Christ we cannot just look at the cost of discipleship. We must also be aware of the grace and blessings that accompany us each day as children of God.

Once a person has found the most precious treasure in life it stands to reason that they are willing to make any sacrifice to have that treasure. In the spiritual sense, this is a call to put aside your old self so that you can be committed to claiming this new treasure as your own, to nurture it and protect it.

May our prayer today be like Solomon's,

"Lord, give to your servant an understanding heart; one that can distinguish right from wrong; a heart that recognizes you as my true and lasting treasure."

A reminder that a charitable tax break for IRA owners is

permanent. Individuals who are 70 1/2 and older can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRAs directly to charity at any time during the year. The tax law that passed December 2015 made this tax break permanent. These transfers count as part of your yearly minimum distribution. There are several tax benefits of these direct IRA payouts to charity. The distributions aren't taxable and won't cause you to have extra income that could reduce your itemized deductions or personal exemptions, or trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits. Of course, you can't also deduct the donation. You may want to consider this for any future contributions, including unpaid pledges to One Faith, One Hope, One Love. Contact your tax advisor for more details.
