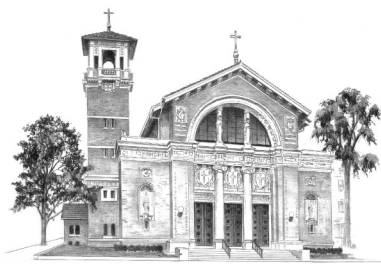

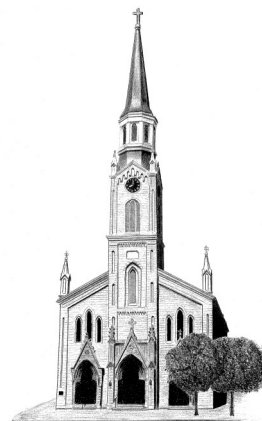

Today is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Today we recall that day when Jesus lead Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. We recall Jesus' face shining like the sun, his clothes shining white as light, the appearance of Moses and Elijah. We remember the casting cloud and the voice that came from the cloud. The Transfiguration is a celebration of the glory and kingship of Jesus.

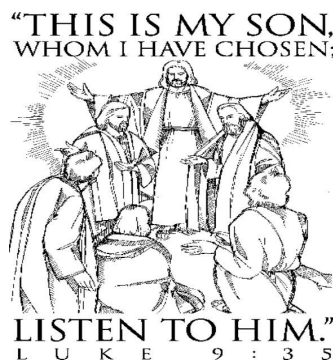
A few years ago I discovered a different view of this story. A few days before Halloween, in a scripture class, the professor invited me to closely study this story. As I read this story verse for verse, and word for word, in the midst of studying and reflecting on the glory of Jesus, the shining face, the bright white clothes, the appearance of Moses and Elijah, the casting cloud, and the voice from the cloud. I thought wow, all the elements are here for a good Halloween story. Think about it for a minute, a person's face and clothes turns bright as light, the casting cloud, and the voice coming from the cloud, all the makings of a scary scene, yet it is in the midst of being afraid when the disciples experience the glory of Christ.

The Transfiguration story is one of my favorite scripture stories. What I like about this story is it occurs at a turning point in the gospel. Just prior to this we have the scripture where Jesus first predicts his passion, the one where Peter responds, God forbid such things will happen. We also have Jesus laying out the price of discipleship, of taking up our cross and following him. Two messages that were difficult for the disciples to hear. From this Jesus led Peter, James, and John up the mountain for a glimpse of his glory. After this glimpse of glory they continued with Jesus, experiencing Jesus healing the boy with a demon, the transformation of the bread and wine into Jesus' body and blood, their departing from Jesus in the garden when he was arrested, and to the resurrection when Jesus returns to the disciples. The Transfiguration is placed at a turning point in the gospel.

Turning points or transitions are a part of life. We each reach moments of transition throughout our lives, when a young child goes to school for the first time, moving away to go to college, that first job or a change of job, empty nest syndrome, retirement, and preparing to meet the Lord at the end of our lives here on earth. Life is full of periods of transition which can be exciting and glorious, but also a bit overwhelming, even scary like the Halloween story. Yet it is in these moments of change, like the disciples on top of the mountain, that we encounter the glory of God at work in our lives.

I am transitioning as a newly ordained deacon and yes there is a lot of excitement and nervousness in this new role in the church. At the same time the glory of God continues to reveal itself to me. This glory has been coming to me in the form of your warm welcome to this Pastoral Region and for this I am most grateful.
