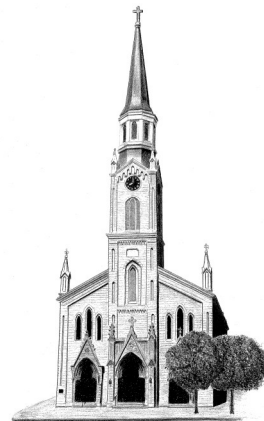

Are you familiar with the term “self-talk?” It’s the running commentary that goes on inside of us all the time. Studies tell us that we speak to others at a rate of approximately 140 words per minute, but we speak to ourselves up to 500 words per minute.

Psychologists tell us that up to 60-85% of all self-talk is negative. In other words, you tell yourself all the things that you can’t do or shouldn’t try; get trapped in a cycle of criticism, cynicism or worry needlessly to yourself at a rate of over 350 words per minute. This is because we are uncertain of who our God & Father is and we too easily fall into fear and self-doubt.

This seems to be Peter’s problem. He was listening to Jesus and responded to his invitation to come out of the boat and walk on the water—but then he started having his own inner conversations which caused him to sink! Think about the times you were invited to walk on water; maybe walking down the aisle on your wedding day or the day you got a medical diagnosis that left you speechless or the day you started a new job or a new course of study. Whenever you take the step to do something you’ve never done before you are being invited to walk on water.

Those first steps are scary and believing our negative self-talk we begin to sink and allow our lives to be dominated by fear, doubt, cynicism, criticism or despair. But Jesus is always ready to reach out his hand and save us. The lesson Peter teaches us is that we must always keep our eyes fixed and focused on Jesus. This is how we can find peace and strength during the storms of life.

Earlier in the 14th chapter of Matthew’s gospel Jesus hears that his cousin John the Baptist has been killed. He knows that if he continues down the same path he will certainly meet a similar end. In the face of this news, Jesus goes off to pray and is renewed to keep going. He walks on water in the midst of the storm to tell us that He is God, He has command over all creation. There is nothing that can stop God’s plan for us if we are open to receive His love.

Just as Jesus went to quiet places to pray, so too, we need times in our lives where we quiet ourselves so that we can hear God’s voice in a tiny whisper. That’s hard to do today with smart phones, Facebook, satellite radio, hundreds of television stations, internet surfing...so many things that can easily create a sort of chaos around us.

Whether our prayer is an emergency plea like Peter: “Lord, Save me!” or a searching prayer like Elijah, Jesus is always ready to offer us a hand to save us. Maybe that hand will come from a family member or a friend, a business associate or a stranger or maybe strength will come in the form of a quiet breeze as you take a walk at night. Remember, God is here with us in every breath we take.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that “Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son’s Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians.” (CCC 966)

Emmanuel Parish CCD Program

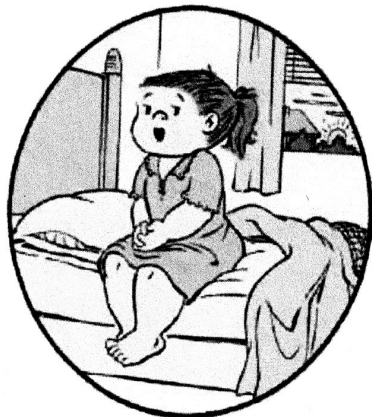

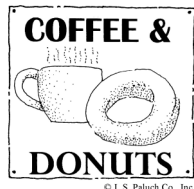
