PASTOR'S PEN

Looking at the various reports of the effects of hurricane Harvey in the news this week you can't help but say, "Life is hard." In a blink of the eye our lives can be turned upside down and all that we counted on for security and safety has vanished. Jesus knew there would be days like this.

In last weekend's gospel, Simon Peter was on top of the world being praised by Jesus for identifying him as the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Peter proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah but his understanding of the Messiah was different from what Jesus was teaching. Peter believed the Messiah was to be about power, victory and glory; restoring Israel to its rightful place.

This week Jesus offers a correction to Peter's thinking by telling his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem, suffer greatly, be killed and on the third day be raised. Peter responds: "No way! God forbid, Lord. No such thing shall ever happen to you." Peter's world is being turned upside down and he reacts in fear. Jesus recognizes that Peter wants him to live on easy-street and says, "Get behind me Satan." This scene reminds us of the time when Jesus was tempted by Satan in the desert to avoid suffering and pain.

Jesus was preparing his disciples for the rough road ahead as they journeyed to Jerusalem. He said, "If you want to follow me, realize that there will be challenges, suffering and crosses to bear." He seems to say, "True love will always lead you to the cross."

In our First Reading, we heard that the reality of suffering was difficult for Jeremiah to accept. People were laughing at him and mocking him and he was ready to give up being a prophet. And yet, there was something like a fire burning in his heart that kept him faithful, that kept him moving forward in his journey. How do we make sense out of suffering and the crosses that enter our lives?

When we connect our suffering to the cross of Christ we can find strength because we know that the cross is not the last word. Jesus is victorious over sin and death and we can share in His gift of resurrection life. When we see suffering as redemptive, we no longer ask "Why is this happening to me?" Instead we ask, "What can I learn from this?" "What is the school of the cross teaching me?"

Someone once taught me that the purpose of the spiritual journey is learning to keep our hearts open in the midst of hell! It's easy to follow Jesus when life is going well. When the cross comes our way, it's easy to shut down and fall into fear and doubt.

Our strength comes from the realization that our God has suffered. He knows our pain. He knows rejection and betrayal. Jesus teaches us that the journey of life is not about finding easy street. It is about being faithful to God, helping one another when the cross draws near, living in the hope that God truly gives us all that we need.
