

PASTOR'S PEN

Over the last couple of weeks, the Weather Channel has been giving regular updates on the paths of hurricanes Harvey and Irma as they appoarched our shores. The role of the weather forecaster is to offer warnings and to help everyone to prepare for the impending storms. Their observations and the awareness they raise helps to save lives for all those in the path of the storm.

I got to thinking about the role of the weather forecaster and the mission that the Prophet Ezekiel was called to do as a watchman for the house of Israel. He was to keep watch and to warn the people of God when they were going down the wrong path; to warn the wicked of their errors. In a similar way, each of us as baptized members of the household of God are called to keep watch on what is going on around us; to speak out when someone is going down a sinful path.

We know the commandments given to us by God. We have the example of Jesus to guide our lives and to shape our consciences. And yet, our world is so complex and the issues of injustice so enormous that we can easily excuse ourselves from getting involved. We say: "What can I do with problems so challenging?" "Oh, I don't want to make waves I'll just step back and protect myself." "Oh, I can't get involved, it might ruin our friendship." It seems to me that the strongest tools of the devil are despair and indifference. If the devil can get us to stand along the sidelines of life and not get involved in challenging evil then his work is so much easier.

Jesus says, if our efforts to speak the truth in love fails to bring about a change or a conversion then we are instructed to call upon the communal nature of the church. It is through prayer, honest sharing and listening to one another that we broaden the circle of understanding and are able to discover the values which can lead to common ground and a new way of seeing.

Each of us is here today because we believe that Jesus is the true light of the world and that His Spirit is active in our lives. Like the weather forecasters who warn us about impending danger, we have heard the call to get involved, to make a difference, to help one another get back on track when we have sinned.

It is difficult to live this call and to be people of hope because there are so many obstacles in opposition to God's dream for us. That is why it is important for us to gather in prayer, to support one another, to be nourished with the



Body and Blood of Jesus and to continue the work of building the Kingdom of God. Take heart from the words of Jesus, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."
