PASTOR'S PEN

Come to the feast! I have prepared a sumptuous meal for you to eat, a meal that you will remember for the rest of you life. When we hear about an invitation to share in a fine meal, we think of a meal of rich food and choice drinks for those old enough this could mean an adult beverage, juicy, rich food and pure, choice drinks.

When I think of a fine meal the image that comes to mind is a generous piece of meat that has been grilled just perfectly, with a potato and hot vegetable. Add salad to help make the meal look healthy. Top it off with something sweet and unhealthy for dessert. As you read this, is your mouth watering?

Now you have just been given an invitation to eat this meal for free no strings attached. Sounds too good to be true, yet you cannot resist accepting the invitation.

What we eat at the feast is important, but who we eat the feast with is also important. Food physically nourishes our bodies, in order to live we need to eat food. But the people that we share a meal with is also an important aspect of the meal. Because when we share a meal with other people we build and celebrate our relationships with each other. Think about what we do when we gather to share Thanksgiving Dinner. All the food at the meal is great, but those that we share the meal with make the meal even better. Think about the bonds that form at a family meal or a couple going on a dinner date together. It isn't so much about the food as it is about spending time together. When he ate with tax-collectors and sinners, Jesus was building a relationship with the outcasts of his society.

When we choose not to share a meal with a person we put up a dividing wall that prevents a relationship from forming. Think about the rejection a young man feels when a young woman turns him down for a dinner date. Or think about how the family structure gets disturbed by families not sharing dinner together. A person choosing not to share a meal with us, even with good reason hurts, particularly when the meal is meant to celebrate something special.

Today the king is celebrating the marriage of his son and the invited guests refuse to come to the feast to celebrate the occasion. The servants summoning the guests to the feast are mistreated and killed. These people were in a certain way creating a dividing wall between them and the king. The king was so hurt by the people refusing to come to celebrate his son's marriage feast, he has these people destroyed. This also would appear to be putting a dividing wall between the king and the invited guests.

The Lord invites us to the table to share in his body and blood. A feast that we will remember for the rest of our lives. Many of us accept that invitation and build that special relationship with our God. Yet we know that others have refused to accept this invitation from our Lord and a dividing wall has formed. And we hurt. Our call as disciples is not about creating more walls to keep people from the table but to find ways of breaking down walls so that all can accept that invitation to share in the Lord's feast.
